Mother Teresa.

As you may be aware, Monday was a special day in the life of the Catholic Church as Pope Francis officially declared and canonised Mother Teresa to become St Teresa of Calcutta.

Mother Teresa was born on August 26th, 1910, in Skopje, , Macedonia, the youngest of three children. Her father died suddenly when she was 9, by the age of 12, she felt called to be a missionary to the poor and at age 18, she joined the Loreto sisters and set sail for India in 1928, where she worked and made her final vows in 1937.

In 1946, she felt a strong call to found a new congregation of sisters in Calcutta dedicated to the "wholehearted free service of the poorest of the poor.

Mother Teresa worked tirelessly for the poorest and most marginalised people in India, yet she often said that "the hunger for love is much more difficult to remove than the hunger for bread. "Her dedication and commitment to the poor was acknowledged in 1979 when she received the Nobel Peace Prize. She died on September 5, 1997, leaving behind a lasting legacy with more than 3,800 Missionaries of Charity sisters, 380 brothers, 13 priests and countless volunteers working in 594 homes in 123 countries.

#### From the Principal:

Catholics believe that if someone is truly a saint, that individual is already in heaven. A canonisation is kind of an "after-the-fact" recognition of what's already happened. It took 19 years after her death in 1997 for her to be recognised as a saint. But there wasn't always a long and complicated process like this.

The early saints like Peter and Paul were simply acknowledged as such by the Church on account of their reputations and (often times) their martyrdoms. But problems with this informal approach began to emerge where people were being recognised as saints sometimes with dubious character or behaviour. Saunders explained in the Arlington Catholic Herald:

Pope Gregory IX formalised the process of canonisation in 1234, requiring the lives and miracles of a candidate to be investigated first. The Congregation of Rites (now the Congregation for the Causes of the Saints) Sainthood basically recognises the holiness of a person's life on Earth and their unity with God after death. Saints are seen as exemplars of the faith and they can be venerated and prayed to. What you need to become a saint There are two main requirements:

- 1. The candidate needs to be a martyr or have demonstrated a life of "heroic virtue" attributes like faith, hope, love, courage, etc.
- 2. Following the death of the candidate, **miracles must be attributed to them** an example would be someone being healed after praying to the candidate, or having a vision of them, or using prayer beads that had belonged to them

In the case of Mother Teresa, there's no shortage of documentation, including public commentary and personal letters. It's also someone's job at the Vatican to play **devil's advocate** and give the case against sainthood (this is how the term came about).

It is the miracles aspect of canonisation that is often strange and confounding — particularly for non-Catholics. Belief in the miracles and resurrection of Jesus are central to Catholicism, belief in every miracle of the saints is not essential to the faith.

We always need people to admire, look up to and try to emulate as best we can. Often sporting legends and famous people can let us down in this area as we are judging them against criteria they did not become famous for. Irrespective of your faith or belief in the concept of saints, Mother Teresa was a person worthy of acknowledgement and impacted, helped and loved many many people, that most others did not give a second glance too. Her belief in this cause and devotion to it is as amazing as some of the claimed miracles associated with her.

#### **Working with Vulnerable People**

There are challenges around the implementing of this and the realities of what schools are like day to day. We share the frustrations while also being obliged to implement and support the expectation asked of all schools through legislation.

#### WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered. It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

#### How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form <a href="https://www.justice.tas.gov.au/working\_with\_children">www.justice.tas.gov.au/working\_with\_children</a>
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.



### Unpacking the daily MYTERN Message: Travel your own road



We are often made to feel that if we are travelling on a deserted road, we must be going in the wrong direction. Explain to your children that everyone has different destinations which usually require different routes. Sometimes our journey will be with others; sometimes it may be going in a completely different direction. Make them understand that it's ok to be on that different road, as it is giving them a completely different perspective.

The rough, lonely red roads are when you get to increase your driving skills; preparing you for moments when times are tough and you need to rely on your resilience.

**Family activity:** Discuss moments when each of you felt you were going in a different direction to those around you. Point out that there is no wrong direction, as each road has its own lessons. Try to give an example from your life when driving in a different direction has led you to the correct destination. May take some thinking, but it will be worth it!
