## FUNDING FOR CATHOLICS SCHOOLS

In the past two weeks the Australian Government have released information regarding a proposed change to the way schools are funded. The impact on Catholic Schools is still being understood.

The Director of Catholic Education in Tasmania, John Mula, shared these comments last week.
"The plan (changes to funding) has received early support from bodies such as the Independent Schools Council of Australia (ISCA). At this stage, the plan does not have the support of the National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC) or the Tasmanian Catholic Education Commission (TCEC) because of a serious lack of detail in the announced plan.

The Catholic sector was not briefed on the detail of proposed plan before its announcement. It is very poor process that the Government has announced this new 10-year school funding proposal without consulting, through the NCEC, the second largest provider of school education in the country.

Our key concern at this stage is that the model is likely to result in the dismantling of Catholic school systems over the next 10 years, especially in regard to the removal of the System Weighted Average funding mechanism.

Last Monday night, the Federal Government launched a new website that lists the Commonwealth funding provided to each school in Australia based on their individual SES rather than the System Weighted Average and followed this launch with a letter from Minister Birmingham to Principals the next day. At best the new website and the subsequent letter is likely to promote prejudicial analysis of how funding is allocated to our schools by their managing authority and at worst the new website and the Minister's letter could be direct attack on Catholic system funding." It is disappointing to read articles in the media that don't include the full facts about how funding works in Australian schools. Catholic schools are NOT fully funded by governments and in fact in Tasmanian Catholic schools we rely on parents fees. Even when Federal and State Government grants are added with parent fees our schools DO not receive the same allocation as other schools from either Independent of Government Schools. This means that our Tasmanian Catholic Schools are required to operate on lower budgets that ALL other school systems in Tasmania. Each one of us who has children, or has had, children in Catholic Schools has the right to have a fair amount of government funding, after all we all contribute taxes. I believe Australians want a fair system where all schools, and ultimately children, are treated equally. It would seem under the proposed budget changes our Tasmanian Catholic Schools will be treated less than fairly. We will keep you informed of any further details.

## STUDENT SAFETY

We take every child's safety seriously. Sometimes we need to change our practises because we believe they need changing to make our school even safer. To this end we will be locking all gates earlier than we have in the past and equally not re opening gates until later in the day.

- We will also be discussing this with your children so they too can close gates if they see them open, and also ask children to inform an adult if they see an open gate.
- Families will notice we have already placed new stop signs on the gates to remind parents and children to close the gates.
- If your child is picked up by others please ensure they read this information or at least you pass it on.
