SAFETY IN AND AROUND OUR SCHOOL

On Tuesday ALL parents were emailed the following email.....

"The safety of our staff and students at Sacred Heart Catholic School is paramount. Being an inner city school means we have to be vigilant in our practices and procedures. We have recently noticed a man walking around the "outskirts" of our school. This has been reported to the police. Our teachers have spoken to your children about what they should do if they see "a stranger". To reinforce this important message all parents should discuss the following with their children.

- Do not approach or engage with people you don't know or feel unsafe around.
- If you notice a "stranger" near our school report this immediately to a staff member at SHS.
- If you see any gate open at SHS close it.

Earlier this term we made a few changes to the opening and closing of gates at our school.

Following these recent incidents we have decided to make a few additional changes. From today the following will apply.

Bourke/Margaret street gates:

- opened by 8:30 am
- relocked at 9.00am (approximately)
- unlocked at 3:00 pm by duty teacher
- relocked at approximately 3:30 pm by duty teacher

York St gate:

- unlocked prior to 8:00 am
- only access point during the day

This means if you arrive after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and sign your child in.

Please note children will NOT be able to leave via the Bourke Street gate unaccompanied. The Bourke St area is predominantly a bus zone pick up area.

We realise this may be an inconvenience for families but the safety of our children is more important. Thanks for your patience and anticipated support.

UNIFORM

In the past fortnight teachers have spoken to a small number of children about school uniform. Please note the following

- Our Sports Uniform includes white or predominantly white socks. Black or coloured socks are not a part of our school uniform.
- Boys are expected to start and end the day with their shirts tucked in. Boys will also be expected to have shirts tucked in for formal occasions.

Catholic Schools Parents' welcomed assurances that low-fee Catholic Education would continue to be provided in Tasmania.

The Tasmanian Catholic Schools Parents' Council welcomed assurances from Catholic Education Tasmania that despite the Federal Governments flawed legislation being rushed through Parliament today, parents and families would continue to be able to access low-fee Catholic Education in Tasmanian.

Executive Officer, Greg Boon expressed disappointment that the Federal Government did not undertake reasonable consultative processes prior to the legislation being tabled and the resulting stressful negotiations over the last month appeared to be more focused on negotiating with the Senate Cross Bench to do what it takes to get the legislation passed rather than consultation with key stakeholders who are charged with the responsibility of providing education to children in Australia, both in the Government and Non-Government Sector.

Mr. Boon stated that any increase in education funding is very welcome and Catholic Parents would be very interested to see that there were positive impacts on education for all students.

Minister Birmingham's agreement to review the socioeconomic status methodology was welcomed as this is crucial, if a more accurate measure of needs basis funding is to be realised. This is an exercise that should have happened over the last two years and formed a sound foundation for the proposed changes to the Education Amendment Bill 2017. It is important that this review is taken seriously and adequate priority and resources are provided.

Mr. Boon expressed his disappointment that any sector of the community would be arguing that Students with Disabilities should be separated from mainstream classes. "This is a practice that our society had quite rightly put behind us many years ago. He welcomed the inclusive approach of Tasmanian Catholic Schools and Colleges.

Mr. Boon stated that realistic Students with Disability funding was needed to ensure that this integration was successful. Student learning outcomes and teacher stress levels should not be compromised because they do not have the resources to teach the unique composition of their individual classes. The Tasmanian Catholic Schools Parents' Council would focus on ensuring that appropriate SWD funding would be provided by current and future Governments.


ROTARY SPONSORS RUBY'S DIABETES CAMP

Nearly 2 years ago I was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes (T1D). This is an autoimmune disease and cannot be cured. So this means my pancreas doesn't produce insulin which is crucial for my blood sugar to be regulated. If I do not do this properly I will get very sick and can affect my eyes, kidneys and veins. I now wear an insulin pump 24/7 and check my blood sugar levels many times a day for the rest of my life.

Last year I went on the 10-12 Junior Diabetes Camp for 3 nights ran by Diabetes Tasmania for my first time. The camp was amazing, we got to do fun activities and meet new

people. I made lots of new friends who also have T1D. People should know about these camps and are really important for people with T1D because as they give you the opportunity to meet new people with the same diagnosis as you, so you know you are not the only one. Last Friday I was invited by Tasmania Diabetes to accept a cheque from The Rotary Club of Launceston for \$1000 to go towards these camps. I got my photo taken by The Examiner and an article went into Saturday's paper.

I will not let my Diabetes stop me from doing anything ever!
