Our Grade 6 children began the Friday afternoon assembly last week, our first for the final term of learning, with the words "shine". They challenged each one of us to consider how our words and actions, when shared with others, have the capacity to turn day people's day around. Messages of hope like these, when shared by children, remind me that the smallest things can and do make a difference, they are not complex and they are something each and everyone of us are capable of achieving.

Schools and homes are places of learning. It is within these environments that children learn from others how to treat one another and how to respond appropriately to any given situation.

In the past week children from our school have "performed in public". On Saturday and Sunday many of our Grade 3 and 4 children participated in the Schools Basketball Championships. We expect every child to display their best manners and reflect exemplary sportsmanship as they are representing our school.

It is always a great pleasure to receive feedback from members of the public about how our children are conducting themselves. It is something we talk to our children about and it is something we expect of our children.

We all know that manners don't just happen they require teaching and reminding, and on most occasions reteaching and re-reminding. When manners are used it says a lot about children. Indeed each and every week teachers, and I'm sure parents, remind children that they should remember to say please and thanks for the many blessings they have in their lives.

It was a wonderful to watch and see so many children thank their coaches and managers for giving up their time to support their teams playing in the basketball tournament. Most assemblies we also remind children to thank their parents for what they do for their children.

As adults it will always be up to us to continually challenge and remind children about standards. We need to model to our children how we expect them to treat others, put simply it is up to us to speak respectfully to and about others if we want and expect our children to do the same in return. Just as importantly we need to show and talk to children about using their manners in every given situation. Ultimately it is our children that will be the next generation of adults who will be setting behavioural expectations for the generations to follow.



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STUDENT MEDICAL DETAIL CHANGES?

Please now consider for your child if since the last advice to the school, medical information has changed & hasn't yet been advised to the school office.

Or you previously supplied an Epi-pen; other medication; or similar which may have since expired, so a replacement is required?

Reminder - Before School expectations

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.

- Mrs. Deb Scott will be at school from 8:00am each school day for any students.
- Students are not to arrive before 8am
- If a student is here before 8:30 a.m. they need to go to the Gym. The cost will be \$2 per child per day, which needs to be paid as the student arrives at the Presentation Gym.
- The child's name will also be recorded on an attendance sheet on a daily basis.

LATE ARRIVALS AT SHS

We have noticed a small number of children arriving consistently late to school. Classes commence at 8.55am. Children who arrive late miss out on critical teaching time. This impacts on children's capacity to receive critical instructions, feeling awkward walking into class late and "trying to catch up" on what they have missed. We understand there occasions where families may be late to school, please ensure these occasions are rare.


