THE INFLUENCE OF PARENTS

"Children learn more from what you are than what you teach." (Anonymous)

Imitation is a wonderful representation of flattery. I still remember smiling and sometimes pulling faces at my girls when they were born. Indeed it still goes on 21 years later. Engaging with your children when they are born is one way of developing bonds, demonstrating your love and developing a life-long relationship. As years pass these actions will always remain important. But others become just as important.

We all grapple with being good parents. I was reading a research article recently by the Australian Scholarship Group (ASG) about the importance of parents in influencing their child's opinion on education. Research is clear, parents who take an active and positive influence in the education of their children can and will assist their child in being more successful at school. Equally a child's success or otherwise at school is the best measure of their future "well-being". Education is one of the most critical investments that parents, families and communities can make. Nelson Mandela once said, "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world."

The 2017 ASG Report Card reveals that parent's aspirations for their children are the most important driver for their children's success. The ASG report suggested that whether children are just starting their primary school years, or they are in their final year of secondary school, it is important parents maintain their value systems and regularly communicate their support of, and expectations for, their children.

Regardless of the type of school a child attends, parents should demonstrate their support of their children, and remind them as they grow and learn how important education is to them. Parents who have a shared passion and aspirations for their children's post-secondary options and future ambitions will positively influence a child's own belief in their ability to succeed.

We are all aware that there will be many influences on a child and the direction that their life takes. Some of these are outside of our control but the positive is that there are many we can influence. These include:

- What you do matters. (Your children watch and learn from actions and words)
- Be involved in your child's life
- You cannot be too loving (Remember spoiling a child is not love)
- Foster your child's independence
- Be consistent
- Avoid harsh discipline
- Establish and set rules, explain your rules and decisions
- Treat your child with respect

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Consider your interactions with our school in the past calendar year. Do you promote the positive in front of your child? When things don't go well at school, how do you respond? When you speak about school and teachers do you respond respectfully? At different times in all of our lives things don't "happen" as we would hope, ultimately the way we respond to them defines us as people. We are the co-creators of the future society, what will the imitators (our children) be mimicking?

CLASSROOM STRUCTURES 2018

One of the great strengths of SHS is having 2 classes in each grade (double stream school). This means there are more children to play and learn with, more children to develop friendships with and more opportunities to expand networks. In single stream schools children have no choice as to who is in their class. This means that for the time they are in those schools they will most likely have the same children with them each year.

With class allocations at SHS, our teachers and school is committed to making sure each year the two classes in each grade are as balanced as possible.

We are finalising the placement of teachers onto classes for 2018. Parents will be advised of the teachers of classes within the next two weeks. We will provide additional information about the process in that time.

Ultimately it is our teachers who know the cohort of up to sixty children best, it is out teachers that are best positioned to accommodate the needs of all children, it is our teachers that spend hours considering all of the information, it is our teachers that we need to trust that are best informed.

Reminder - Before School expectations

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.

- Mrs. Deb Scott will be at school from 8:00am each school day for any students.
- Students are not to arrive before 8am
- ❖ If a student is here before 8:30 a.m. they need to go to the Gym. The cost will be \$2 per child per day, which needs to be paid as the student arrives at the Presentation Gym.
- The child's name will also be recorded on an attendance sheet on a daily basis.

LATE ARRIVALS AT SHS

We have noticed a small number of children arriving consistently late to school. Classes commence at 8.55am. Children who arrive late miss out on critical teaching time. This impacts on children's capacity to receive critical instructions, feeling awkward walking into class late and "trying to catch up" on what they have missed. We understand there occasions where families may be late to school, please ensure these occasions are rare.
