## From the Principal

### Our SHS Team...One of Sacred Heart's greatest strengths

*"Individually we are one drop but together, we are an ocean."

We all know Sacred Heart has a significant number of teams. Each one of us is a member of at least one team. Some of our staff are members of more than 5 teams. *The most important is of course the SHS Team.* Reflecting on the past 17 months of my time at SHS I suggest teams are even more important in bigger schools. SHS has two of each class, more children and more staff than our smaller Primary Schools, it is, therefore, critical that we have a common understanding, common language, common behaviours, common expectations and common purpose. This doesn't mean individuals shouldn't share their personalities, rather it means they should be committed to a common good, **to provide the best possible Catholic education for the children of SHS.**

Last Friday at the Assembly we shared the importance of every member of our community. Each one of us contributes to the overall. Our individual actions and behaviours reflect on the whole team (for example how children wear uniform and how we speak to and about one another).

A few things then to reflect on, in the knowledge that every student, parent and staff member is a member of the SHS Team....

Research about "successful teams" suggests that they

- Work together for a common purpose.
- Have a "Growth Mindset".
- Are constantly reflecting on their own actions and what they can do to help the team improve.
- When faced with challenges they are looking for solutions.
- Aren't perfect and they see challenges as opportunities for growth.
- They judge their own behaviours first and foremost.
- Embrace change as an opportunity for growth.
- Enjoy and celebrate when others in the team succeed as it reflects positively on the whole team.

## Our SHS Team....One of Sacred Heart's greatest strengths... continued

One of the greatest joys of being Principal at Sacred Heart is seeing and hearing about the many and varied examples of team actions. In the past three weeks alone I share the following

- In the past three weeks Prep Best, Grade 4 VR, Grade 4W and 6S invited me to spend time in their classrooms working with small groups. The children were amazing. Dedicated learners supporting classmates by remaining focussed on their learning, allowing others to focus on their learning, encouraging others and giving everyone time to consider answers to questions. *(Clear examples of team players)*
- Last week the Grade 5/6 children were preparing for the Gala Day tomorrow. At the end of the game we asked the children to share the highlights. EVERY child shared something positive about other children. Not one child said "I was brilliant, I kicked 5 goals". The focus was on the success of team mates and positive encouragement. *(Team players)*
- Last week some parents and children stayed till the end of the ECE Cross Country Carnival to support children who weren't friends or relatives. This is a wonderful example of how we as adults can show school and house spirit. Is every child important at SHS? Do they all deserve to finish with a large crowd to support them?
- In the past 4 weeks there have been up to 90 children attending Cross Country training at 8am in the morning. Parents, children and staff giving up time to support the SHS Team.
- This week, and indeed every week, all of our teachers and support staff spend time engaged in conversations with our children in their break time. They give up time that they are entitled to, to ensure the children of SHS are listened to, challenged, supported and encouraged.

This newsletter could go forever.... Because these are just a few examples amongst so many of people around our school who are considerate of others. Team players who put the SHS Team before themselves. I know how fortunate I am and I honestly go to bed each night saying thanks for the blessing of SHS.

Consider this week

- How am I contributing to culture of the SHS Team?
- What behaviours of mine am I proud of? What behaviours do I need to develop?
- Do I notice the positive contributions that everyone makes towards the SHS Team?
- What else can I do to support positive growth of the SHS Team?



The Entertainment book/digital membership fundraiser is well under way and thank you to the many school families and friends who have already purchased their membership. Your support is fantastic and much appreciated.



## WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered. It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

**If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event.** This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

### How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form [www.justice.tas.gov.au/working\\_with\\_children](http://www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children)
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

**Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.**

## Reminder - Before School expectations

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.

- ❖ Mrs. Deb Scott will be at school from **8:00am** each school day for any students.
- ❖ **Students are not to arrive before 8am**
- ❖ If a student is here before 8:30 a.m. they need to go to the Gym. **The cost will be \$2 per child per day, which needs to be paid as the student arrives at the Presentation Gym.**
- ❖ The child's name will also be recorded on an attendance sheet on a daily basis.


