I have found myself watching 'I'm a Celebrity Get Me out of Here' more than I wish I did. I find it interesting to see how people are portrayed either through 'select editing' or how they choose to portray themselves knowing that the cameras are there. The situation must be such a 'fishbowl' At the same time it is compelling and frustrating to see how such petty and trivial things escalate into such big issues.

Alternately, how appreciative and grateful they are for small things that we often do not appreciate until we are without them. Aristotle is accredited with the quote "...we are what we repeatedly do. Excellence, then is not an act but a habit." A habit we continue to aspire everyone in and associated with S.H.C.S. to have is an 'Attitude of Gratitude.' The following is taken from an article (Thanks Nat for the link)

'Make Your Life Better by Saying Thank You .' by James Clear:

When you're receiving a compliment.

We often ruin compliments by devaluing the statement or acting overly humble. Internally, you might think this prevents you from appearing arrogant or smug.

The problem is that by deflecting the praise, you don't acknowledge the person who was nice enough to say something. Simply saying "Thank You" fully acknowledges the person. Getting compliments should be fun and enjoyable, but we often ruin the experience. There's no need to sabotage compliments that come your way. Accept them with grace and enjoy the moment.

When you're running late.

Being late is the worst. It's stressful for the person who is running late and it's disrespectful to the person who is waiting. Most people stumble in the door and say, "Sorry I'm late." Saying "Thank You" turns the tables and acknowledges the sacrifice the other person made by waiting. Thank you for waiting. When we make a mistake, someone else often makes a sacrifice. Our default response is to apologize for our failure, but the better approach is to praise their patience. Thank them for what they did despite your error.

When you're receiving helpful feedback.

Feedback can be very helpful, but we rarely see it that way. The standard reaction is to get defensive. That's a shame because the correct response is to simply say, "Thank You". Nobody likes to fail, but <u>failure is just a data</u> <u>point</u>. Respond to helpful feedback with thanks and use it to become better.

From the Principal:

When you're receiving unfair criticism.

Sometimes criticism isn't helpful at all. It's just vindictive and mean. One of the best approaches is to just say thank you and move on. When you thank someone for criticizing you, it immediately neutralizes the power of their statements. If it's not a big deal to you, then it can't grow into a larger argument. Releasing the need to win every argument is a sign of maturity. Win the argument by the way you live your life.

When someone gives you unsolicited advice.

Everybody has an opinion on what you should do and how to do it, or in hindsight what you should have done. I think most people are just trying to be helpful, but hearing someone's opinion about you when you didn't ask for it can be annoying. Just say "Thank You." Pointing out others faults doesn't remove your own.

'Addressing the people and his disciples Jesus said, 'The scribes and the Pharisees occupy the chair of Moses. You must do what they tell you and listen to what they say; but do not be guided by what they do, since they do not practice what they preach....The greatest among you must be your servant. Anyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and anyone who humbles himself will be exalted.' (Matthew 23 1-12:)

The act of saying Thank you more often, or the act of not saying thank you enough, are actions of habit that either model gratitude or model a lack of gratitude in action. As tough as it is to swallow this is true. The challenge we all face is creating the habits to avoid being scribes or Pharisees.

- The child's name will also be recorded on an attendance sheet on a daily basis.


KINDER 2017: IMPORTANT INFORMATION



WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered. It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you may not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form <u>www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children</u>

- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity
- Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
