NAPLAN results for 2015 were made public yesterday, with our school doing very well when compared to other Tasmanian and National Schools. However this is one test on one day about a narrow aspect of learning and what our school offers and provides. I hope prospective parents to SHCS decide to come here on more than just NAPLAN results.

Having attended Grade 5 Camp and currently on Grade 6 Camp, it is obvious to me that the importance of giving our young people a chance to get to know their peers outside of the classroom, to learn about building and maintaining positive relationships with others, as well as appreciating the love and care their families have for them, is a critical component of growing into young people of worth.

It is a privilege and a humble experience to get to know our students beyond surface level conversations through the experience of Camps. I want to acknowledge Mrs. Illingworth, Mrs. Karen Cettolin, our Office team as well as teachers who support me being able to attend Camps through leading the school in my absence.

I take great pride in the quality young people we have in our school. Tonight I will also be privileged to meet future families committed and supportive of the values, ethos and mission we are endeavouring to foster here at SHCS, hopefully also motivated to be part of S.H.C.S.

# WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered. It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you may not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

### **How to apply for a WWVP and Number**

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working\_with\_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.


