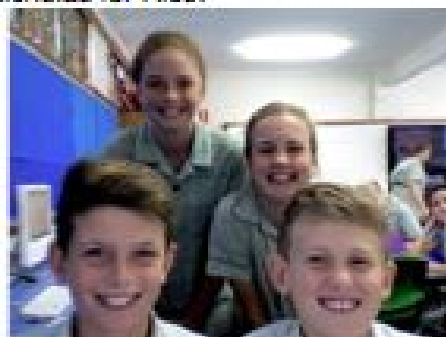
Sacred Heart Leaders

S.H.S History



The Presentation Sisters arrived in Tasmania in 1866. In 1873, they came to Launceston to set up a school. Our school, Sacred Heart School, started up on the 7th of February in 1873 and is still going to this day. The Presentation House is sadly not a part of our school any more but in the past was the Nuns house and also held a few classrooms. The house is now used by the parish.

A large weatherboard building was added in 1878. This contained four rooms with separating folding walls. In 1889, a large single roomed building was built further uphill and later became the infant block. Later in 1985 both buildings were demolished. In 1967, a large block containing science laboratories and more classrooms was opened. This building was renovated for the early childhood and Primary classrooms in 1985.

Our school has changed so much over the years. Like in 2012 when the new gym was built (photo top left) and in 2013 the prep to two building was renovated.

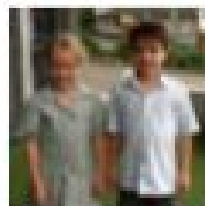
What Do You Like Most About Sacred Heart?

What do you like most about Sacred Heart?

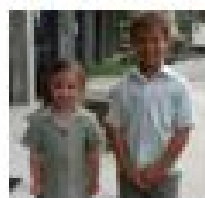

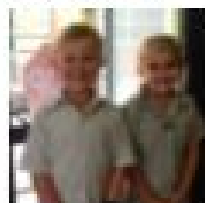
