



We certainly want our students to read for understanding, at the same time we want our students to love and engage in reading for the pure enjoyment of it.

Schools are now sometimes 'factories of learning'. There is increasingly more and more 'important content and knowledge' we expect our students to know. There should be accountability for what schools do in supporting learning however there also needs to be trust and greater autonomy to have time to engage students in their interests, their passions and problems they want to try and solve.

A love and appreciation of music or reading is something we aspire all to have. At the same time it is difficult to 'assess' this love and assess the level of appreciation alone. Sometimes the assessing and focus on getting students to learn to read can risk the enjoyment and engagement of reading itself.

#### From the Principal:



SHCS staff are currently discussing the idea of Discovery Days. The idea being to allow some time for our students to be engaged in discussing, sharing, problem solving or creating things that are of interest to them. They choose the areas or the problems and how they want to share their learning with the class on it. At this stage we have invited all staff to think about trialling this concept in some way that suits their class and their needs. We have many students that if given the chance to direct their learning or engage and share their passions and interests through school, would thrive, perhaps even more than they would with the current experiences they have at school.

I am looking forward to seeing what comes from these conversations as a staff and what as a result flows into classrooms.

#### **School Oval Upgrade**

We have confirmation from Tasmanian Catholic Education Office that we can proceed with the upgrade of our School Oval. It is going to be significant work that will be undertaken. It will mean:

- Our oval will be 'out of action' from a yet to be finalised date in October, for the remainder of the school year.
- Carols on the Oval this year will be at STM on Wednesday November the 30th. More information to come.
- Infant Athletics Carnival will not be on our oval this year and a new venue will be finalised shortly.

This is a frustration however it means that when 2017 starts our oval will be actively used much more than currently is the case. It also means our school oval is being used when the building program is underway and parts of the area near the 'pencil' playground may be fenced off.

As stated previously 4 days access of the oval in a term of 50 days is unacceptable and unfair for our students, particularly in a school that is restricted with the amount of space that we have.

#### **Triathlon**

A letter around the Primary Triathlon competition that many of our students competed in last year has been emailed to parents. The school coordinated the registration on behalf of parents and students last year and we will do the same again. This year though registration in the event will not be confirmed until payment is made. The payment is low (\$15)and the school covers the cost of the bus to and from Devonport for students as well as having a teaching staff member attending.

#### WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered. It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you may not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

#### **How to apply for a WWVP and Number**

- 1. Complete the online application form <a href="www.justice.tas.gov.au/working\_with\_children">www.justice.tas.gov.au/working\_with\_children</a>
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.






