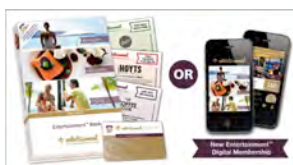

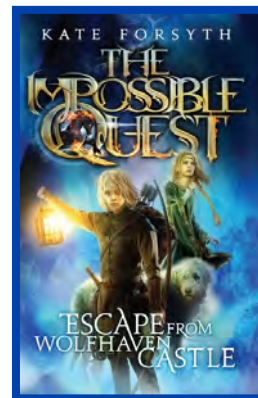

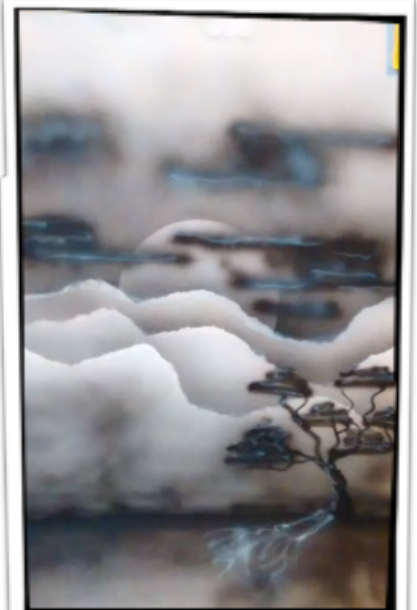

CO-TEACHER MATHS STUDENTS VISIT TO THE AMC

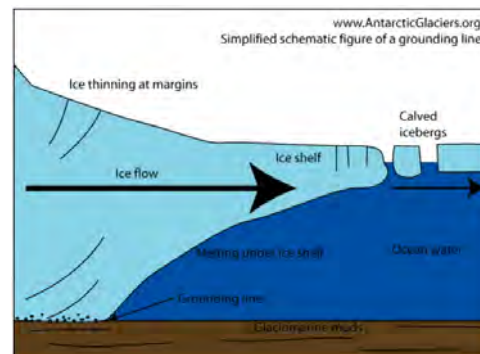
Check out this miniature yellow submarine!

It's called an AUV which stands for Autonomous Underwater Vehicle. Last week some maths students visited the Australian Maritime College. We were the first class in the world to see this amazing new AUV.

Dr Irene, Dr Rock and Dr Damien showed us around and took us into one of the lecture theatres for a mathematics lesson.

Cool facts about the AUV:

- surveys the ocean's depths and collects data for research missions
- dives to depths of up to 5000 metres
- is remotely controlled (there is no pilot inside)
- is about as big as a family size 4 x 4 car
- cost about \$6 million dollars!!
- has a lithium battery much like what you have in your ipad or iphone.
- everything can get wet inside except for the computer
- a smaller version of it has surveyed below the Batman Bridge



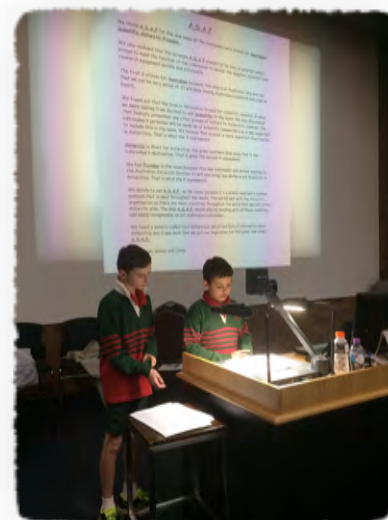
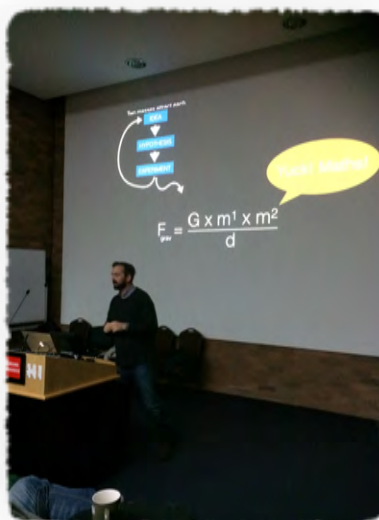
This amazing piece of equipment picks up little bits from the ocean bed that have been there since the Cretaceous period, Triassic period, Jurassic period and maybe even older than the periods we know.

The AUV is used among other things to map under ice sheets and shelves.

Here is a diagram:

As you can see it is very difficult to get to the glaciomarine muds and it is very hard to map the grounding line. Humans cannot go to such inhospitable places. But the AUV can! It will be launched from a vessel like the new unnamed icebreaker. Grade 5 and 6 students have entered a national competition to name the new icebreaker. The prize is a trip to Antarctica for the day!
