From the Principal:

PLAYGROUND AND BUILDINGS UPDATE

Buildings (Block B, C and E Redevelopments)

Late last term the major aspects of our building project were completed. All classes were moved into their "long-term spaces". As with any building project there are normally things that need finishing off as they weren't completed as per the plans. In Block B (Library and Grades 3/4), Block C (Grade 5) and Block E (Kinder and Grade 6) builders will be working on rectifying the "finishing off items" during the Term 3 holiday period.

Prep Awning and Oval

We are also hopeful that the long awaited Prep Awning will be completed during the Term 3 break. Similarly our Oval will be redeveloped in this period. For many years our children have had far too many days in the winter period unable to access the oval. The oval will have new drainage and new turf installed as a means to providing a better quality surface for our children.

Playground Master Plan

Earlier this year the SHS Board discussed how we could continue to provide for the future of our school. We identified that once our building project was completed we would be targeting our play spaces. Our Board have agreed that it is important we consider all of our play spaces at SHS. We have appointed a playground master planner to work with us to ascertain what is best for our children and future generations.

We established a Playground Team that includes representatives from our Board, Parent and Staff community. The Team are working on the premise that the purpose of our Master Plan for the Play spaces is...

"Sacred Heart School Outdoor play spaces should cater for all ages (4-12) with a variety of opportunities to participate in outdoor play experiences."

The Parents and Friends have committed significant financial support this year and agreed to provide even further financial support in the next four years as we "roll out new playspaces". Our school will also committing funds towards the playground to ensure we provide the best possible outdoor spaces.

Our Board have crafted a planned and strategic method to arrive at an outcome that benefits not only the current generation of children but the thousands of children that will enrol at our school in the years ahead. 



3 Sacred Heart students selected in North Melbourne football academy.

On Tuesday the 18 of July at Elphin Sports centre, over 1,000 children from the age of 11-15 tried out at the northern Tasmania tryouts for the North Melbourne next generation academy.

The elite development program is for 11-15 year old girls and boys of all backgrounds. Max Roney (Gr5), James Leake (Gr6), Fletcher Harper (Gr6), were all successful in making the team. Participants undergo skills training, drills and games on field under the guidance of highly skilled and qualified coaches. They also learn about North Melbourne values, rules, sportsmanship and leadership. The trainings are well organised each week and they have been learning a lot to do with football.

Jackson Radley 2017 Show Horse Nationals

As some of you might know, in November I am going to represent Tasmania at the Equestrian Australia Show Horse Nationals for competitive horse riding. At this particular competition, I will be competing against some of the best riders in Australasia. There is approximately 60 different classes held throughout the 4 day competition with nearly 20

competitors in each class. The judging consists of 3 separate judges who score each horse accordingly and at the completion of the judging the scores are tallied with the highest scorer being awarded with the Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons. The competition takes place at the Werribee Equestrian Centre in Werribee which is approximately 45 minutes drive away from the Spirit of Tasmania terminal in Melbourne.

Werribee Equestrian Centre is one of the biggest horse facilities in Australia and the whole of the competition takes place in an indoor arena which is under lights and decorated with lots of signs and colours. I will be away for 8 days in total and it will be really fun as I will have all my horse riding friends there to watch, cheer on and ride alongside. I will be taking my three horses; Bambi, Slimey and Prim and I am really excited to go and represent Tasmania and have a lot of fun with my friends.



SCHOOL BANKING NEWS

Important Information for Catholic Development Fund Kookaburra Club Account Holders

The school has been informed that the Catholic Development Fund (CDF) Hobart will soon be combining with other CDF agencies across Australia to form a new **CDF Community Fund.**

The new fund will allow students to continue their support of the Archdiocese of Hobart by banking their deposits with the new CDF Community Fund.

If parents wish to keep their child's current account and continue making deposits, the CDF Hobart will arrange to transition your child's account from a CDF Kookaburra Account to a **31 Day Mission Saver (Student) Account** as offered by the newly formed CDF Community Fund.

The transition of accounts will take place on **Tuesday 24th October 2017**. All students who have a current CDF Kookaburra Club Account should receive a letter from the CDF explaining the changes. The letter will also provide the option of transitioning to the new Mission Saver Student Account or closing the current Kookaburra Club account.

If you wish to transition to the Mission Saver Student Account, it is the school's understanding that parents do not need to reply to the CDF's letter. Not replying indicates that you are satisfied for your child's Kookaburra Club Account to be automatically transferred to the Community Fund's 31 Day Mission Saver (Student) Account on 24th October.

If you do NOT wish to transition to the Mission Saver Student account then the CDF Hobart will provide you with the option of closing the Kookaburra Club account. If students/parents wish to close their CDF Account you will need to provide alternative account details for the CDF to transfer the balance of the account to. A form will be provided with the CDF's letter and reply-paid envelopes will be included for completed closure of account forms to be returned to the CDF. Please note that for the account closure to occur, your child's account closure form will need to be returned by post and be received by the CDF no later than Friday 20th October 2017.

Please bear in mind that this is a CDF driven process and not a school process. 


Woolworths Earn & Learn 2017
