From the Principal

Forgiveness – "A universal value....."

"Forgiveness does not change the past, but it does enlarge the future." (Paul Boese)

"Are you perfect? "....."Do you ever make a mistake?"

As a member of the human race we all know that we all make mistakes from time to time. At Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School we challenge our community to be better people by learning from our mistakes. Does that mean we will never make a mistake again? Of course not, some people may continue to make the same mistake over and over again. In fact there is research that suggests that some of Einstein's greatest theories were not conceived until after thousands of attempts.

We are challenged by the words Jesus used when he spoke in the Gospel of Matthew of the importance of forgiveness. He reminds us that we need to forgive people not 7 times but 77 times 7. In other words it is up to all of us to continue to forgive people who make mistakes. We are reminded that all of us start each day afresh and should not continue to "hold a grudge" against another person because of some past misdemeanour.

We too as parents need to continue to look for the good in all children and adults. We must challenge ourselves to use the guiding words of the Gospel as our "words of wisdom" when faced with the child that comes home with a story that "he/ she has been unkind to me again". This can be hard and indeed challenging but in my experiences children are very ready to forgive and happy to start each day anew. The important role that we play is to model the behaviours for our children.

Forgiveness - "A universal value....." continued

This week our children will be faced with a "tricky situation", that is after all what living in a community is all about, good times and tough times. The real worth of a person can be judged on how they respond to the "tricky situation". Do I look for the good in every human being?

Ask your child and yourself this week

- Do I treat all people the same?
- Am I as quick to forgive others, as I am to condemn?
- Do I start each day afresh with all members of the community?
- How do I model with my child the gospel values of the forgiver?

Thirty One of our children received the sacrament of Reconciliation last week. Sacraments are "guide posts" that point us in the direction of Christ. Reconciliation is an opportunity for all of us to be reconciled with our God. As a universal value forgiveness can happen without any of us needing to attend and celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Look around our school community this week and notice the truly unique creations that exist within our school community, children, parents and staff. Each and every member of our school community deserves to be loved and respected, each one of us is imperfect and each one of us is on a journey, a journey that none of us could possibly understand without living in their shoes. The rich tapestry of the Sacred Heart community only exists because we are all very different.

At different times in all of our lives things don't "happen" as we would hope, ultimately the way we respond to them defines us as people. We are the cocreators of the future society, what will the imitators (our children) be mimicking?


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Entertainment Books Fundraiser for 2018

It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration. If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to. How to apply for a WWVP and Number 1. Complete the online application form <u>www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children</u> 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified. **Reminder - Before School expectations** Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier. Mrs. Deb Scott will be at school from 8:00am each school day for any students. Students are not to arrive before 8am If a student is here before 8:30 a.m. they need to go to the Gym. The cost will be \$2 per child per day, which needs to be paid as the student arrives at the Presentation Gym. The child's name will also be recorded on an attendance sheet on a daily basis.


Student toilets are locked daily at approximately 3:15pm-3:30pm. There is a toilet located in the administration building, which is opened until 4:00pm daily.

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


Annual Procession of the Blessed Sacrament for the Feast of The Body & Blood of Christ. SUNDAY 3 JUNE 2018.
