In classes and in our play times, when needed students are encouraged to consider what road they are on rough/red roads or smooth/green roads. Then it's important for them to check if they are in control. And if not, what PETs (personal emotional tools) could they use to regain control.

We are wanting the students to begin to gain an understanding of where they emotionally (the "name it to tame it" awareness) and then find strategies or PETs to regain that control. Knowing that we are in control of our own steering wheel and where to steer it is key to emotional regulation.

Posters are set up around the school to remind children about this, with many PETs displayed as reminders opposite the canteen going into the gym. Perhaps it might be a good time to revisit what are your PETs and how you can call on them whenever you need to. Maybe discuss as a family. Maybe make a list or display at home. HERE'S SOMETHING GOOD TO KNOW: Deep, slow breathing is the easiest "go to" PET for everyone - easy to access, no need to pack, everyone has a set of lungs to use!

What road are you on?

Are you in control?

If not, what PET can you use to regain control?



HEALTH (John Anderson)

During Health lessons this term students in Grades 3-6 have been learning about safety issues that students may encounter in their everyday lives, assessing risk, making decisions and behaving in ways that protect their own safety and that of others.

We have learnt some basic first aid, studied what DRSABCD means, learnt about calling 000 in an emergency and discussed how defibrillators work.

We have talked about water safety, how to spot a rip, what to do if you're caught in a rip and why it's a good idea to swim between the flags at a beach.

The children have learnt what the AquaCode means:

Go together, reach to rescue and stay afloat & wave.

Seasons for Growth Grief Program

Learning to live with change and loss

Our school has over recent years offered Rainbows as a program to support children dealing with Grief and Loss in their lives. Last year and this year we are working with CatholicCare and are able to offer a similar program called Seasons for Growth, where young people may benefit from learning how to manage these changes effectively. This program is facilitated in small groups and is based on research which highlights the importance of social support and the need to practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. The program focuses on issues such as self-esteem, managing feelings, problem-solving, decision-making, effective communication and support networks.

We are pleased to be able to offer this important program and we are confident that it will be a valuable learning experience for those who attend.

The Seasons for Growth Program runs for eight weeks and each weekly session is 40 – 50 minutes. The program concludes with a 'Celebration' session.

Our next sessions will be held for Grades 5 and 6 students

and will begin in late this term on 14th September.

Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- call the School office on 63311011
- •email shsl@catholic.tas.edu.au
- ·use the Skoolbag app, fill out an eForm
- advise their teacher

If you arrive at school after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.

It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent.

Signing students out during the day

- -You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave early.
- -Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Reminder - Before School expectations

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.

- Mrs. Deb Scott will be at school from 8:00am each school day for any students.
- Students are not to arrive before 8am
- If a student is here before 8:30 a.m. they need to go to the Gym. The cost will be \$2 per child per day, which needs to be paid as the student arrives at the Presentation Gym.
- The child's name will also be recorded on an attendance sheet on a daily basis.

Reminder that dogs are not permitted on the school grounds without prior permission from the Principal

TOILET ACCESS AFTER HOURS

Student toilets are locked daily at approximately 3:15pm-3:30pm. There is a toilet located in the administration building, which is opened until 4:00pm daily.
