From the Principal:

Reconciliation includes Forgiveness

"The world's problems begin with the belief that some human lives are more valuable than others." (Nelson Mandela)

Last night 17 children from Sacred Heart joined with several other children from the Launceston Parish to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation. Reconciliation is founded on our Christian belief of forgiveness.

At Sacred Heart it is one of our foundational beliefs that we are called to forgive those that do things to us, or our families and friends, that we are hurt by. Equally we are called to forgive ourselves when we make mistakes.

These values are mirrored in our PBS (Positive Behaviour Support) program that has been embedded at SHS for 5 years. Under PBS all children are explicitly taught appropriate behaviours. When children behave outside our school expectations we provide additional support to help them make better choices into the future. As a part of the restorative process children who 'hurt' others are asked to provide meaningful apologies, they may also have other consequences. Does this mean they don't make the same mistake again? Of course not, children are like us, they sometimes make the same mistake on several occasions. Does this mean we accept their inappropriate actions? No, under the PBS model, we need to continue to work with children to continue to support every child to make better decisions.

Sometimes this can be hard. No one likes to be hurt and no one likes to see their children upset. As a Catholic school we will continue to support every child. This is what we are called to do in Catholic schools. At some point this week there will be someone in our community that will do something to someone else that is upsetting. This comes as no surprise to anyone, because we cohabit a space where we are consistently interacting with others. How we respond to inappropriate actions says as much about ourselves as it does about others.

When I write these comments I immediately think of the way I behave as a father, husband, friend, colleague, principal and member of our community. I'm like everyone else, a person who makes mistakes, someone who isn't perfect. What I am constantly called to do is to reflect on my own behaviours and in particular my responses to other people's behaviour. I will always be the only person who can make improvements in my own behaviour just as I am always called to forgive others for what they do regardless of how they have made me feel.

In our readings this week Jesus reminded us of the most powerful commandment.

"Love one another as I have loved you." (John 13:34-35).

Take a moment with your children this week to reflect on the words of Nelson Mandela and the teachings of Jesus Christ and consider....How will I respond?

Service notes

Current service relies on connection to Route 283 to Riverside, which will no longer exist. Any students from Blackstone Heights will need to change to Route 167 at Prospect Marketplace.

This service will set down students at the bus stop in Margaret St near York St.

Travel from West Launceston and Summerhill is recommended on Route 167.

Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- call the School office on 63311011
- email shsl@catholic.tas.edu.au
- use the Skoolbag app, fill out an eForm
- advise their teacher

If you arrive at school after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.

It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent.

Signing students out during the day

- You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave early.
- Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Fire Alarm

A reminder that if in the instance a fire alarm is sounded whilst parents are on the school site, you are required to assemble on the oval. Students remain with teachers as part of the process is for the staff to ensure all students are accounted for. If parked on York when the fire engine arrives it is vital that you vacate the area to allow the fire engine access.
