From the Principal:

"Sacred Heart is a Professional Learning Community"

"While we try to teach our children all about life, our children teach us what life is all about." (Angela Schwindt)

Four years ago Sacred Heart began exploring what it meant to be a Professional Learning Community (PLC). A PLC is a group of educators that meets regularly, shares expertise, and works collaboratively to improve teaching skills and the academic performance of students.

As a staff we are committed to continuing this journey. Research is clear, the single biggest difference we can, as educators, make to a child's learning is 'collective teacher efficacy'. Collective teacher efficacy refers to a staff's shared belief that through their collective action, they can positively influence student outcomes, including those who are disengaged and/or disadvantaged.

Professional Learning Communities ask one another 4 critical questions...

What do students need to know and be able to do?

- A PLC is characterised by the belief that the fundamental purpose of the school is student learning.
- In a PLC, all staff members believe that all students can and will learn. They demonstrate high expectations for all students.
- A PLC immerses teams of teachers in curriculum and professional development, building a shared knowledge about what students need to know and be able to do.
- A PLC supports teams as they clarify the essential outcomes that students need to learn for each unit of study.
- In a PLC, teaching teams meet regularly. They focus their time on discussing student performance and teaching strategies. They maximise their time together through the use of ground rules and norms.
- In a PLC, all staff members feel that they have a responsibility to support school improvement and they feel involved in the decisionmaking processes of the school.

How will we know when they have learned it?

- In a PLC, teams of teachers develop and use common formative assessments to monitor student progress on essential outcomes.
- Teachers have developed a common understanding about what characterises student performance that is proficient and student performance that is not proficient.

What will we do when they haven't learned it?

- In a PLC, teachers use formative assessments and other sources of data to identify students who are in need of extra time and support.
- In a PLC, if a student is having difficulty learning, there is a school-wide systemic response to provide extra time and support to that student. Intervention is not left to the individual teacher.
- In a PLC, interventions are carefully matched to the individual needs of students.
- In a PLC, there is a system in place to make sure that all interventions are frequently monitored and evaluated to determine if they are having a positive effect. Ineffective interventions are modified or discontinued.

What will we do when they already know it?

A PLC provides all students with a rigorous and challenging academic program. Pre-assessment strategies are used to determine if students already know content. Advanced instruction and materials are then provided for these students.

Our school is like all Tasmanian Catholic Schools, committed to continuing to work towards these goals. Are we there yet? In short, no, we have travelled a long way in the past 4 years and we will continue to challenge ourselves and our educators to work together for the children of Sacred Heart. One of the things I love about our school is working with a committed team of educators that continue to look for ways to improve as teachers and as a team of educators.

Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- · call the School office on 63311011
- · email shsl@catholic.tas.edu.au
- · use the Skoolbag app, fill out an eForm
- · advise their teacher

If you arrive at school after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.

It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent.

Signing students out during the day

- -You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave early.
- -Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Fire Alarm

A reminder that if in the instance a fire alarm is sounded whilst parents are on the school site, you are required to assemble on the oval. Students remain with teachers as part of the process is for the staff to ensure all students are accounted for. If parked on York when the fire engine arrives it is vital that you vacate the area to allow the fire engine
