

From the Principal:

"Happy Father's Day"



"Helping your child stick at it..."

Does your child sign up for activities - sports, dance, clubs, music lessons - and then quit when it gets too hard or they say they are sick of it? Because parents know how they had to persevere in life, they are naturally worried their child may become a quitter.

- Don't think of your child's character as fixed. Most of our worries about our children are about the future. We see the 9-year-old who quits as the aimless 20-year-old. But who they are now is not who they will always be.
- Explain the difference between "I don't want to" and "I don't feel like it". Distinguishing long-term desires from immediate feelings will help children understand the difference between an immediate task and ultimate goal. This is a lesson that doesn't register right away, but it's worth planting the seed and emphasising over time.
- Let them know you see the areas in which they do work hard or show motivation. Say "I know you're someone who can stick with things when they're important to you".

- Get to the root of their concern. Why don't they want to go? Perhaps they feel they aren't as good as the others. What might make that better? Extra practice with your help? Help them see we often have to be not so good at things for a while as part of the process of getting good at something.
- Children should have control over their own lives but that doesn't mean they can back out of a commitment, or waste the money parents have paid for lessons or gear. If they are adamant, then expect them to write a letter to the coach or organiser explaining why they are quitting. This makes them take ownership of their decision. They cannot ask parents to phone and get them off the hook.
- **Keep exploring.** It may take a while to find what really motivates and enthuses them. There's no rush!
- We can't make them develop grit. We can expose them to things they may like, support them in sticking with things as they get harder and express confidence that they can handle the stress or the boredom.
- The world is so complex that we have no idea where the things that will turn our kids on come from. If we encourage children to keep seeking what they love, and to work hard at it when they find it, that will help them grow into confident and self-directed young adults.

Pen Down Day and Bookweek

This year at Sacred Heart, we combined Pen Down Day with Book Week. Pen Down Day is a day where we do not use pens/pencils to learn, instead putting these tools aside for a minimum of two hours during the day to focus on other ways of learning, in particular developing and enhancing our oral language skills. Oral language is a vital skill which paves the way for reading and writing development in the Early Years and is considered to be a strong indicator of later reading, writing, and overall academic achievement, continuing to be an important life skill in Upper Primary. Research indicates that classrooms inclusive of oral language activities also helps with pupil engagement and student outcomes. Many classes used Book Week books to provide a stimulus for this learning and integrated other learning areas such as the Arts, Technologies and Health. The engagement of the children was superb and there was a great 'vibe' around the school. Some of the activities included making scenes from books using concrete materials, collages, plays, designing and making recycled goods and creating movies using ICT. We finished the day with 'guest readers' sharing a story with buddy classes. Thank you to all the staff who planned such quality and engaging activities for the students to enjoy and for the students for participating with such enthusiasm.

Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- call the School office on 63311011
- email shsl@catholic.tas.edu.au
- · use the Skoolbag app, fill out an eForm
- · advise their teacher

If you arrive at school after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.

It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent.

Signing students out during the day

- -You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave early.
 - -Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working-with-children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Fire Alarm

A reminder that if in the instance a fire alarm is sounded whilst parents are on the school site, you are required to assemble on the oval. Students remain with teachers as part of the process is for the staff to ensure all students are accounted for. If parked on York when the fire engine arrives it is vital that you vacate the area to allow the fire engine access.
