## From the Principal:

### "The importance of play..."

'The creation of something new is not accomplished by the intellect but by the play instinct...' (Carl Jung)

Earlier this month our school spent time in Book Week enjoying 'Pens Down Day'. Our prime goal was to specifically focus on developing and focussing on oral language. Many of our classes were drawn to organising learning opportunities that focussed on play. This is not unusual for our children as teachers know that play is critical to the development of every child. Indeed we as adults know that it is important to balance our lives with opportunities to play. Who will ever forget the famous saying, 'All work and no play makes Jack a dull boy.'

In the United Nations Convention on the Rights of a Child, it states that 'play' is the right of all children. This reinforces the value placed on 'play' both here in Australia and internationally.

You will often hear educators use the terms 'play-based learning' or discussing the importance of play in early childhood.

In developing our new 'playspaces' at Sacred Heart the Playground Team's aim is to support the children's natural curiosity, eagerness to learn and their love of communication with others. Our learning environment is designed to provoke curiosity and constantly challenge children's thinking.

Here are our top 5 reasons why play is important in the early years:

- Developing secure attachments: Through play children begin to foster secure attachments to their peers, families and educators. Strong relationships are the key to children feeling safe, secure and supported, which impacts their learning, happiness and self-esteem. Parents are a child's first teacher and much of that teaching happens through play.
- The effect of play on brain development: Play has intellectual and cognitive benefits for the brain and it is believed that play can in fact shape the structural development of the brain.
- Development of learning skills: Through play children develop important learning and life skills such as exploring, identifying, negotiating, risk-taking and imagining.
- Speech and language development through play: During play children are watching, listening, exploring and imitating. Even when your child is playing silently, they are learning important information and exposed to new vocabulary that they will carry with them and use later.
- The ability to regulate their behaviour: As children play they are learning skills such as how to concentrate on a task, how to take turns and how to share. In turn these will aid them in regulating their behaviour and emotions.

Play leads to enhanced school adjustment and, most importantly, a love of learning. When children play and learn new things they discover that learning can be fun and go on to view learning as something enjoyable, rather than a chore.

In these upcoming holidays take the time to play with your children, even if it is only half an hour longer that you have in the past. Not only will your children benefit from the experience but you too can expect to enjoy the time relaxing, learning more about your children, yourself and improving your own quality of life.

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- 1. Complete the online application form <a href="https://www.justice.tas.gov.au/working-with-children">www.justice.tas.gov.au/working-with-children</a>
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

#### **Fire Alarm**

A reminder that if in the instance a fire alarm is sounded whilst parents are on the school site, you are required to assemble on the oval. Students remain with teachers as part of the process is for the staff to ensure all students are accounted for. If parked on York when the fire engine arrives it is vital that you vacate the area to allow the fire engine access.
