“Make little things great”

‘Do small things with great love...’ (St Therese)

Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- call the School office on 63311011
- email shsl@catholic.tas.edu.au
- use the Skoolbag app, fill out an eForm
- advise their teacher

If you arrive at school after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.

It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent.

Signing students out during the day

- You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave early.
- Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Fire Alarm

A reminder that if in the instance a fire alarm is sounded whilst parents are on the school site, you are required to assemble on the oval. Students remain with teachers as part of the process is for the staff to ensure all students are accounted for. If parked on York when the fire engine arrives it is vital that you vacate the area to allow the fire engine access.

When a child needs your help, get the help you need.

What is the Advice & Referral Line?

The *Strong Families, Safe Kids Advice & Referral Line* is the first point of contact for child wellbeing and safety. With a coordinated network of government and non-government support – and your help – we can deliver earlier intervention and better outcomes for at-risk children and their families.

Who is the Advice & Referral Line for?

Everyone with a concern about the safety and wellbeing of a child: Mandatory Reporters, concerned relatives, friends or neighbours. Parents and children can also call to ask for help for themselves.

What happens when I call?

Your call will be answered by a *Strong Families, Safe Kids* staff member who will talk to you about the situation, answer your questions, give you information or advice, and if needed arrange a referral to a service which can best meet the needs of the child.

Importantly, every call is prioritised to determine the most appropriate response – including a recommendation for an urgent safety assessment if warranted.

How does the Advice & Referral Line work?

The *Strong Families, Safe Kids Advice and Referral Line* works collaboratively between the caller, government services and non-government services.

Our goal is to work with the whole community so that everyone takes on a shared responsibility for the welfare of every child, ensuring that help comes earlier, and that information, advice and assistance is provided in the right way at the right time.

That way we can make sure we respond earlier to keep children safe and help families be strong.

Because we all want children to be safe.

And we all have a part to play.
