From the Principal:

"The Voices of Children"

"I believe the children are our future. Teach them well and let them lead the way. Show them all the beauty they possess inside." (Whitney Houston)

It is the job of teachers and parents to help children find their own voices. It is our job to explore ideas, discover new worlds, write poetry, tell stories, sing songs and paint pictures. Even within the confines of our packed curriculum, the true job of the teacher is to take children on a journey to discover their talent and potential. And, as we do this, we too learn and our students change our lives, our world and how we see it.

Children can often see clearly the faults of the adult world, can understand complex issues, stand up for their beliefs and do what they think is right. Sometimes children prick our consciences and show us a better way.

Malala Yousafzai was a schoolgirl aged 11 in Pakistan when she spoke out about the rights of all girls to be educated. The Taliban tried to assassinate her as she travelled home on the school bus. But they did not silence her. We all watched as she recovered from her injuries and spoke at the United Nations. She was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize, the youngest person ever. She changed the lives of many children. She changed the world for the better.

Now we have Greta Thunberg, a young teenager, who has decided it is time the world moved faster to combat the threat of climate change. She went on strike from her school. Her message went round the world. Millions of children have gone on strike and marched in the streets, demanding we end this injustice to our planet, this injustice to future generations.

The lesson for all of us is never to underestimate a child's potential. They need everything we can give them at school to fulfil themselves and make the best of themselves.

Jonathan Bryan has cerebral palsy and locked-in syndrome. He cannot speak at all and relies on his family and helpers for everything. But his mother knew Jonathan could hear, see and smile. She believed he could communicate and used his ability to blink and move his eyes to teach him to read and write. After many years he could spell out words, make sentences and even make conversation. He has now written a book titled "Eye Can Write" and is a campaigner for the education of all children.

His message is simple: Never underestimate a child's potential. Give us the teaching, give us all we need to fulfil ourselves. Each and every day at Sacred Heart I personally notice things about your children that inspire me to be a better person. To name just a few

Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- call the School office on 63311011
- email shsl@catholic.tas.edu.au
- use the Skoolbag app, fill out an eForm
- · advise their teacher

If you arrive at school after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.

It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent. Signing students out during the day

-You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave

early.

-Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form <u>www.justice.tas.gov.au/working with children</u>
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity
- Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Fire Alarm

A reminder that if in the instance a fire alarm is sounded whilst parents are on the school site, you are required to assemble on the oval. Students remain with teachers as part of the process is for the staff to ensure all students are accounted for. If parked on York when the fire engine arrives it is vital that you vacate the area to allow the fire engine access.

Family Discount can be claimed by families with multiple children at Tasmanian Catholic schools or colleges in accordance with Catholic Education Commission School Fee Assistance Policy. The discount rate is

- 3 children 10% discount on tuition fee only
- 4 children 20% discount on tuition fee only
- 5+ children 30% discount on tuition fee only

We will apply this discount once the payment plan form is returned and completed.

Music program will be invoiced in April and added to your school fees. \$550 per year with instrument hire or \$320 if you have your own instrument.
