From the Principal:

"Advent..."

The season of Advent commenced on Sunday. John Mula, Executive Director of Tasmanian Catholic Education, shared the following ...

"Sunday 1 December is the first Sunday of Advent. Looking around town it's obvious that retailers have 'jumped the gun' so to speak in promoting the festive season. For Christians, Advent can be a challenging season to observe because it is swamped by all things Christmas and all things commercial. Carols are piped throughout shopping centres which are full of Christmas decoration and advertising; card writing is in full swing and our children are working on Christmas themes at school. Maybe all this activity is a form of active waiting, of expectation that something important will happen in the end.

Waiting in expectancy is like waiting in the darkness at a concert for the lightshow to commence. We know something exciting is about to happen and everyone else is waiting with the same expectation. We might know what to expect because we saw the advertisement, bought the tickets, looked over the programme, but the experience is yet to happen. So, we wait expectantly, open to the experience about to unfold.

During Advent as we wait in expectation of Christ's coming, it could be that the bright lights, the prospect of presents and special food, leave us unable to recognise what it is for which we are 'waiting in expectation'. We might 'miss out' on the coming of Christ in whatever manner that coming might manifest itself to each of us. The simplicity and openness of the newborn Christ child, shows us how uncomplicated it can be for us to build or renew our personal relationship with God. The Advent wreath with the 'Christ candle' in the centre might help keep in focus the reason for our 'waiting in expectation'.

Classing Arrangements and Orientation Day

Children moved to their "new teachers" and "new classmates" this morning. We all know that teachers spend considerable time considering all the possible scenarios when they place children and we also know that our teachers need to be aware of all the children in the classes when making the best choice. One of the great things about our school, different from many other primary schools, is that our school, because of its size enables us to mix children year after year, this means that children will be able to develop new relationships.

As teachers we have no doubt there will be some children who return home from school today excited about what 2020 will bring, equally there may be some children who will return home disappointed for varying reasons. It is in moments like these that we as parents impact on how children are likely to continue to respond. If we choose to look for fault in the decision and provide children with a reason to continue their disappointment then this is exactly what your child will do. Alternatively if we look for the positives then children will take the lead from adults.







Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- call the School office on 63311011
- email shsl@catholic.tas.edu.au
- use the Skoolbag app, fill out an eForm
- advise their teacher

If you arrive at school after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.

It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent.

Signing students out during the day

- You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave early.
- Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Fire Alarm

A reminder that if in the instance a fire alarm is sounded whilst parents are on the school site, you are required to assemble on the oval. Students remain with teachers as part of the process is for the staff to ensure all students are accounted for. If parked on York when the fire engine arrives it is vital that you vacate the area to allow the fire engine access.

Family Discount can be claimed by families with multiple children at Tasmanian Catholic schools or colleges in accordance with Catholic Education Commission School Fee Assistance Policy. The discount rate is

3 children 10% discount on tuition fee only

4 children 20% discount on tuition fee only

5+ children 30% discount on tuition fee only

We will apply this discount once the payment plan form is returned and completed.

Music program will be invoiced in April and added to your school fees. \$550 per year with instrument hire or \$320 if you have your own instrument.
