
This means students will commence Term 3 at SHS on Wednesday 22nd July.


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Carry the Lantern wíth Dígníty, Courage and Compassíon.

As Catholics we celebrated the birthday of the church on Sunday, with the feast of Pentecost. This was the day when the Holy Spirit ascended in the hearts of the Apostles, Mary and other followers of Jesus. Jesus had promised he would send the Holy Spirit to them and this is the day He fulfilled His promise.

The Holy Spirit came bringing seven gifts that enabled these people to go out and spread the news of God. It made the Apostles speak in many languages, gave them courage, made them wise and faithful. Luke writes, Jesus told His Apostles He would send the Holy Spirit and when He did they would be even greater than He was at spreading the Word of the Lord.



When our children receive the Sacrament of Confirmation they receive the Holy Spirit and all these gifts too. We too are Jesus' disciples setting out to share the good news. The simplest way to do this is by our actions, by loving one another just as Jesus loved us. In recent turbulent events in America it is easy to cast judgement from afar. But how do we treat others, how do we show empathy, how do we teach our children about equality? Much of this is taught by the example we set. Understanding and recognising the Holy Spirit in our lives equips us with a life compass. In the weeks ahead let us give ourselves time to listen to the Holy Spirit within us and be guided by its power.

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Dear Parents / Guardians,

We have been given advice from Catholic Education Tasmania (CET) that the Launceston Catholic Schools Instrumental Music Program can recommence. The program will restart as of the normal lesson times this week in your primary school. As we prepare for this, there are some things that you need to be made aware of. These points have been listed below.

NO CHANGE:

- Time and date remain the same at your school;
- Same tutor / groups / books;
- Same expectations;
- Same length of lesson;
- Can still seek assistance from your instrument tutor. DIFFERENT:

DIFFERENT:

- Less / no large group playing;
- More hygiene procedures;
- More physical distance between some instrument groups;
- No sharing of equipment ie; can't give a new reed to someone if they forgot theirs;
- No live performances in the near future (at this stage);
- More time to learn new music and new skills along with now being able to access the online Music site for extra help;
- Different start and end to lessons due to hand washing etc;
- Some groups might be in a new teaching space;
- If you son / daughter is slightly unwell they are not to participate;
- Each Band student will be given a 'cleaning' pack that they will be responsible for to take home and launder the cloth/s provided and return them for use in their next lesson.

For the program to continue without any issues, the DIFFERENT measures put in place will need to be strictly adhered to. The most effective preventative measure is good hand hygiene so please ensure students and yourselves use sanitiser before and after lessons please.

We thank you once again for your patience over this very different period of time and we look forward to a successful remainder of the year.
