Sacred Heart Feast Day 2020......

Tomorrow is the Feast of the Sacred Heart. As a school this is our day to celebrate. The devotion to the Sacred Heart is one of the most widely practiced and well-known Catholic devotions, taking Jesus Christ's physical heart as the representation of his divine love for humanity.

Normally on this day we gather as a school to celebrate Mass. This is our core belief of the centrality of the eucharist to our faith. Following Mass we organise children into groups to participate in activities where children are challenged to reflect the core gospel values of our school, compassion, cooperation, consideration, collaboration, team work, dignity, honesty, team first and respect. Our final celebration for the day is centred on watching the talents of our children via Sacred Heart's Got Talent.

In 2020 the Feast of the Sacred Heart has been postponed, for our school. Due to the restrictions of COVID-19 we have discussed with Fr Mark that we would still like to celebrate Mass later this year. We have claimed a new date Friday 28th August to gather 'in some way' to celebrate as a community.

We don't need to wait for the Feast of the Sacred Heart to reflect core Christian principles. Each one of us should continue to look for ways we can place others first and ourselves second. Working in a school community we see hundreds of examples of children and adults consistently looking for and enacting positive disciple values.

As members of the SHS community this is what we are called to do. One day each one of us will no longer be students, parents or staff members of the SHS community. It is our responsibility, as the current custodians of SHS, to leave our school in a better place than we find it. We must continue to challenge ourselves to be better people so our school becomes an even greater school.

It is a formal day (solemnity) in our Catholic Church.


It is the day our school name was inspired by. We recognise that Jesus' heart shows His divine love for all of humanity.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1.Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
