

Social Media

In recent days we have made aware of an increased use of social media and messaging apps which students are using to connect with peers. These tools can help us stay connected and have been extremely beneficial during lockdown, however they can also be used inappropriately, either through the content shared, or the writing of hurtful comments and unfortunately, we have received reports from across our school that some students have been using these tools inappropriately. As a parent it is important, we are familiar with our child's online usage, what apps they are visiting and who they are communicating with. There are plenty of websites to support with this, a good place to start is the eSafety Commissioner website and our teachers will continue to teach and promote good online behaviours. And most importantly we need to monitor our children's online usage and engage with them about what they are doing online.

As adults we also need to ensure that we are good e-citizens, being mindful of what we post on apps like Facebook and as our content can be sometimes misleading or hurtful. The best solution to resolve a concern with another person is to directly approach them with a curiosity to understand, publicly posting opinions or half-truths is not a helpful way to resolve anything. WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1.Complete the online application form <u>www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children</u>

2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full

 Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the

school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.



Following the conclusion of the fare amnesty period, from Monday 6 July all Metro Tasmania services will resume fare collection and boarding from the front door. Perhaps most pertinent is that Metro is still asking passengers to avoid cash payments on board, or to have the correct change if they must pay cash, wherever possible. A simple way to avoid cash payments is to carry a Greencard (which are currently free) and can be managed through a Greencard online account, which allows passengers to top up online and even set up an automatic top up, so they never have to worry how much money is on their Greencard. We have been informed by StateGrowth that fares will be charged effective from Monday 6th July.

To reduce the handling of cash for everyone we have Smartcards.

Smartcards can be applied for at www.manionscoaches.com.au or contact the office 6383 1221.

We have an app called Transportme which is free to download to your phone, choose the passenger version.

Funds can be added to the Smartcard from a credit card via this app. Cost per ride with a Smartcard is \$1.44.

You can also see where the bus is in real time plus there is the option to save a stop and get notified.

Sheets of 10 bus tickets for \$14.40 are available from each bus driver, however to avoid handling cash please contact the Depot 6383 1221 to pay by card and we can send the tickets to the driver or post them out.
