Being Authentic

"Knowing yourself is the beginning of all wisdom." (Aristotle)

What does it mean to be authentic in today's world? It doesn't mean just being different or standing out from the crowd, but it does mean having a firm understanding of just who you are.

"Genuineness." "Authenticity." These words are kind of hard to say and, for many people, even harder to be. However, there are some hallmarks that illustrate what it means to be authentic.

First of all, authentic people are aware of their thoughts and feelings, and they behave in ways that reflect those feelings. They don't see any need to "Put on an act" to impress or control others. They accept their vulnerabilities as well as their strengths, and they know that accepting something isn't necessarily the same thing as liking it. Do you want to know something else? Because they accept themselves for who they are, they accept other people as they are, as well.

Authentic people don't laugh at jokes they don't think are funny. They don't change their identity, like chameleons, depending on who they are with, or where they are. So, if you want to grow as a person, take time to really know yourself. If you're not completely happy with what you find, that's OK for now. Work on accepting yourself for what you are, right here, right now, and work on being truly authentic. This is the strong foundation from which we can work to make positive changes in ourselves.

Carl Rogers, a world-famous psychologist, once said that when we accept ourselves exactly as we are, change becomes much easier. There is a very good chance he was right, because then the change process has that solid place from which to start. We measure growth from where we are to where we want to be. If we don't know where we are, it's a little difficult to pin down just how we are going to get to where we want to be.

If you are the boss, you may not always like what your employees do. But in your role as a leader, you do have skills to guide them toward a more fully-realized version of who they can be. If you are a parent, take a tip from another famous Mr. Rogers: Let your kids know that even though you may not always like what they do, you love them for who they are – just the way they are!

Being Authentic (continued)

One of the greatest strengths of Sacred Heart is the uniqueness of our community, 465 children, 52 staff and more than 1000 parents and carers are all very different in their own ways. The one thing we all have in common is our connection to the SHS community. Take a moment this week to consider what each and every individual brings to our school community. When we search for a 'glass half full' approach to others we will notice the beauty each and every person has within. What do you notice in yourself and others this week?

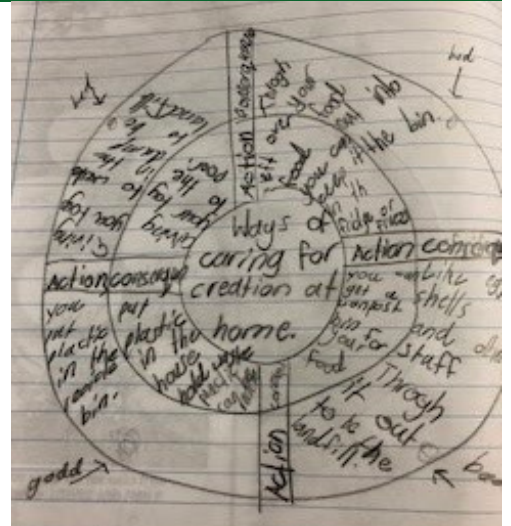

In our Religion classes children are continuing to learn about their Christian Life. They are recognising the great love God has for them and how they can show their gratitude and love, by supporting others.

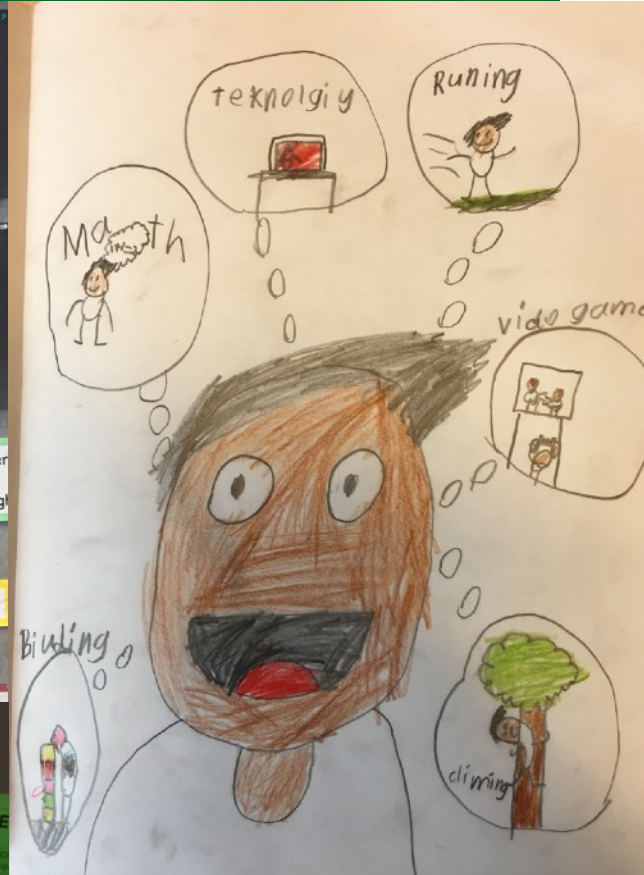

Collection and eftpos payment of uniform orders are done by appointment (between 2-4pm Thursday) and will be arranged by Kelly and Rebecca.

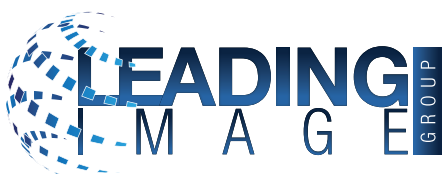

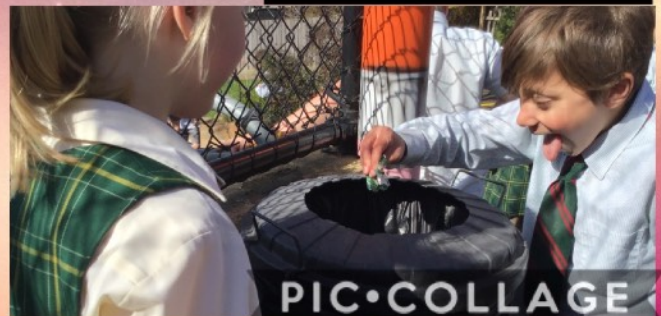

New Canteen Ordering System

Sacred Heart will be utilising St Patrick's College canteen for lunches for Prep to Grade 6, two days a week.

Our school will have lunches delivered for second lunch only (1:30pm) on Tuesdays and Thursdays. If ordering lunch (on these days) parents need to consider this lunchtime will be later than the students are used to, so additional food for 11:00am first lunch may be required.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
