## Setting Goals for Term 4

*"Positive thinking will let you do everything better than negative thinking will."  
(Zig Ziglar)*

Our staff team spend time reflecting on the behaviours of the children of SHS on a regular basis. As a school PBS (Positive Behaviour Support) has been an established part of our culture for more than 6 years. Positive Behaviour Support is grounded on the principles of recognising positive behaviour in children and teaching appropriate behaviours when they are not.

In Term 3 we established a new initiative at Sacred Heart for every child from Prep - Grade 6. We challenged children to challenge themselves to develop a goal that improves their behaviour. As members of the human race we know that we can always do things better than we currently do. Our SHS Pillars are often used as a guide to the behaviours we aspire to achieve. At the beginning of each term our staff spend time with children re-establishing routines, specifically teaching children the expectations of classroom routines, appropriate behaviour inside and outside the classroom and working to support children in what we at SHS expect.

This term children will continue to work on the goal they had set themselves, refine the goal they had or establish a new goal for Term 4. Listening to the children what is very apparent is that our SHS children know what they can be better at. Speaking with children this week it is impressive to hear children are challenging themselves to aim even higher with the goals that they are establishing. A few examples of what our children have chosen include:

- I will keep my bag locker tidy
- I will put my hand up more in class
- I will use better eye contact when I'm talking to people
- I will include others in my games
- I will remember to always walk inside
- I will focus on improving my own behaviour
- I will keep my hands to myself
- I will remember to wait for my turn
- I will listen when others speak to me
- I will remember to put my hand up when I have a question
- I will remember to use an inside voice in the classroom
- I will complete my work neatly
- I will make sure that I look after my belongings
- I will share my ideas with others in group activities
- I will use my best manners
- I will greet people when I see them
- I will be a Go Kart in class
- I will talk less to my friends during eating time

## Setting Goals for Term 4 (con't)

Each teacher is working to support children by scaffolding these goals. Each child has been asked to develop the goal based on their greatest challenge. Ask your child tonight what your child is working on for Term 4.

### Celebrating our Faith.




This week our classes have commenced celebrating a liturgy with their buddy class. The theme of Term 4 Liturgies is *Our God, the Giver of Life*. Children will listen to readings from Genesis and from John. Both are about God’s wonderful creation. Father Chatty will help us appreciate the amazing gifts we have been given and how much God loves us. It will be extra special to share this celebration with our buddy classes.



Next week marks two Holy and Almsgiving days in our Liturgical calendar. All Saints Day on the 1st of November and All Souls Day on the 2nd of November. These are days when we pray for our Saints and martyrs and all the Souls who have departed our world. It is not a coincidence that the celebration of halloween is on the 31st of October, In the 9th Century Pope Gregory placed this ancient Celtic celebration here, to enable Chirstians to pray for the departed. Have you considered the connection between the Our Father and Halloween? In the second line of this prayer it states, ‘Hallowed be Thy Name’, meaning Holy is Your Name (God’s). The word halloween means Holy Eve and was once called All Hallows Eve. As this tradition seems to become more prevalent in our society every year, it is important to remind our children about how this is connected to our faith. It is a time when we remember the Saints, martyrs and those who have died and pray for them and celebrate them.

## New Canteen Ordering System

Sacred Heart will be utilising St Patrick's College canteen for lunches for Prep to Grade 6, two days a week.

### **WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION**

**If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event.** This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

#### **How to apply for a WWVP and Number**

1. Complete the online application form [www.justice.tas.gov.au/working\\_with\\_children](http://www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children)
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

**Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.**
