Forgiveness – “A universal value.....”

“Forgiveness does not change the past, but it does enlarge the future.” (Paul Boese)

“Are you perfect? ” “Do you ever make a mistake?”

As a member of the human race we all know that we all make mistakes from time to time. At Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School we challenge our community to be better people by learning from our mistakes. Does that mean we will never make a mistake again? Of course not, some people may continue to make the same mistake over and over again. In fact there is research that suggests that some of Einstein's greatest theories were not conceived until after thousands of attempts.

We are challenged by the words Jesus used when he spoke in the Gospel of Matthew of the importance of forgiveness. He reminds us that we need to forgive people not 7 times but 77 times 7. In other words it is up to all of us to continue to forgive people who make mistakes. We are reminded that all of us start each day afresh and should not continue to “hold a grudge” against another person because of some past misdemeanour.

We too as parents need to continue to look for the good in all children and adults. We must challenge ourselves to use the guiding words of the Gospel as our “words of wisdom” when faced with the child that comes home with a story that “he/ she has been unkind to me again”. This can be hard and indeed challenging but in my experiences children are very ready to forgive and happy to start each day anew. The important role that we play is to model the behaviours for our children.

This week some of our children will be faced with a “tricky situation”, that is after all what living in a community is all about, good times and tough times. The real worth of a person can be judged on how they respond to the “tricky situation”. Do I look for the good in every human being?

Ask your child and yourself this week

- Do I treat all people the same?
- Am I as quick to forgive others, as I am to condemn?
- Do I start each day afresh with all members of the community?
- How do I model with my child the gospel values of the forgiver?

Thirty four of our children received the sacrament of Reconciliation last night. Sacraments are “guide posts” that point us in the direction of Christ. Reconciliation is an opportunity for all of us to be reconciled with our God. As a universal value forgiveness can happen without any of us needing to attend and celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Look around our school community this week and notice the truly unique creations that exist within our school community, children, parents and staff. Each and every member of our school community deserves to be loved and respected, each one of us is imperfect and each one of us is on a journey, a journey that none of us could possibly understand without living in their shoes. The rich tapestry of the Sacred Heart community only exists because we are all very different.

At different times in all of our lives things don't “happen” as we would hope, ultimately the way we respond to them defines us as people. We are the co-creators of the future society, what will the imitators (our children) be mimicking?

“Life is an echo. What you send out, comes back. What you sow you reap. What you give, you get. What you see in others exists in you. Remember, life is an echo. It always gets back to you. So give goodness.” (Anonymous)

NAPLAN

This week the Grade 3 and 5 children participated in NAPLAN testing. Australian children are assessed in Numeracy and Literacy. The assessments assist schools by providing an additional piece of information about each child's progress. Our teachers use this information along with a broad range of other assessment tasks to develop an understanding of children's progress. As educators this once piece of data informs our discussions along with all other pieces of evidence.

Families are encouraged to contact classroom teachers if they require more information about how children are progressing. At the end of this term we will be providing Parent/Student/Teacher conversations that will assist parents in supporting their children.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded
