Tomorrow parents will receive a mid-year report for their children. Next week will be an opportunity to discuss the first half of the year with your child’s teacher. Reports will be shared via COMPASS after 3pm Friday 25th June, please be patient as they will take time to download from our server. Parent Student Teacher Conversations will be facilitated on Wednesday 30th June and Thursday 1st July.

Our teachers spend hours crafting each written report and preparing for Parent Student Teacher Conversations. Capturing the progress each child has made in the past 100 school days takes careful thought and energy. Our teachers place tremendous importance on getting this right. We spend time in our teams moderating work samples, discussing the progress of each child and reflecting on what each child needs to focus on for future growth. Yes this is what teachers are employed to do. I’m proud of the time, care and thoughts every teacher at SHS puts into this aspect of their role.

Every teacher has shared positive comments and celebrations about the achievements of each child in the first half of 2021, comments designed to challenge children and to consider how they can make an improvement in their work habits or behaviours.

Next week families will be provided with the opportunity to meet with teachers to discuss and listen to the progress of their children. As teachers we see these conversations as an opportunity to celebrate the progress of every child, consider and reflect on the challenges of each child and establish goals for the second half of 2021.

One of the great strengths of Sacred Heart is the partnership between our school and families. Research shows that communities who work together for a common cause achieve outcomes that are more successful than when they work against one another. Next week our teachers will be listening to information you share and sharing details of their observations with the intent of what we can do together that will assist the children to continue their progress. We look forward to continuing to work with families for the betterment of your child.

3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

**Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded**
