COVID Undate

With the current situation around Australia, I think it is timely to remind you all, of our current Covid related requirements. I wish to thank all of you who have been very supportive and understanding of our current situation. Currently regular school activities are to operate as per normal. We will continue to advise you of any restrictions around special larger events. Below are our individual responsibilities:

- Anyone who displays cold or flu symptoms must not enter the school site.
- If children display cold or flu symptoms during school time we will be calling you to request you collect your child from school.
- Anyone who is waiting for a Covid test result must not enter the school site.
- Anyone who has travelled to a high-risk area must not enter the school site until cleared by a medical practitioner.
- Anyone requested to guarantine must not enter the school site.

These rules are in place to ensure that we are all kept safe.

We also request that if your child is sick, that you keep them at home, as a day's rest is beneficial for a speedy recovery and prevents the disease from spreading. Over recent weeks we have had many staff members off sick, creating an interruption for the learning of the whole class. Your support is greatly appreciated.



WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded
