## "Founder's Corner" ....

*'Educating hearts and minds...'* Edmund Rice

On Friday morning we gathered as a community to pray, bless and give thanks for a new addition to our school, 'Founders Corner'. This space was created with the intent of reminding our community of our heritage. It pays homage to our founders, The Presentation Sisters who first educated girls from 1873 and The Christian Brothers who began educating boys in 1919.

**Edmund Rice** was born in Ireland in 1762. He was a lucky man, who had a nice life. He was a successful businessman, but realised that there were so many poor children in Ireland who needed help. He left his job and wealth and set up schools to feed and educate the poor boys in Ireland. He taught them about God and how to be good people. He said his calling from God was to EDUCATE HEARTS and MINDS.

Soon other men came to help Edmund Rice and that is how the Christian Brothers were formed. This organisation of Catholic men spread all over the world. They came to Tasmania too and started little St Patrick's boys school in 1919, which we now call Sacred Heart Catholic School.

**Nano Nagle** was born into a wealthy family in Ireland, in 1718. At this time the leaders didn't like Catholics and they made it illegal for Catholic children to go to school. Fortunately, Nano and her sister came from a wealthy family that was able to smuggle them to Paris for a full Catholic education.

When Nano Nagle came back from her school, she saw how poor the Catholic people and children of Ireland were. She opened a secret school to teach them, hoping that this would help them be able to live better lives. Nano Nagle was always helping. Her motto of 'Not words, but deeds' describes how she lived her life. By seeing something and doing it. By helping, educating, praying and sharing God's word. Other ladies came to help Nano Nagle, they too lived out her motto and went all around the world, helping and teaching children. These ladies who did God's work were the Presentation Sisters of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Presentation Sisters even came to Launceston and began teaching girls here at Sacred Heart in 1873.

Sacred Heart Catholic School is indebted to these remarkable women and men who had the foresight and ongoing commitment to educate children in our Catholic faith with the intent of accepting children regardless of their needs and background.

It is our responsibility, as the current custodians of SHS, to continue their mission. Our current cohort of 465 children is made up of 300 families. We are blessed by the individualism and uniqueness of each and every child. We know that each one of these children will behave in different ways at different times. It is our responsibility to challenge ourselves to continue to look for ways we can support children as they grow closer to being the person that Jesus intended them to be. At times you may hear children described in a negative light, remember it is our responsibility to look for the good in each child.

In the final 8 weeks of this year let us all take the time to give thanks to the Presentation Sisters and Christian Brothers for establishing the community we are all the beneficiaries of.

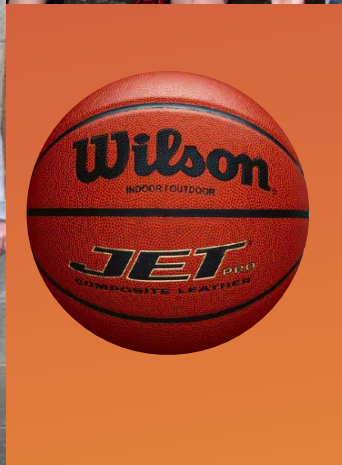
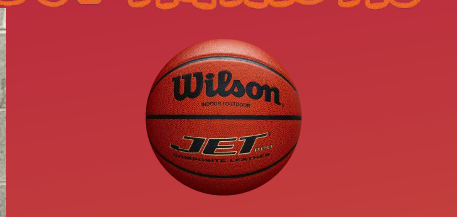

On the last day of Term 3 the Sacred Heart Green Team went on an excursion to Andrew, Sarah, Poppy, Annabelle, Charlie and George Ebbelaar's farm. The reason we went to their farm was because we were going to plant trees and bushes for native animals to live in. These trees and bushes are called a green belt and it encourages native animals to live at the farm again.

We went to the farm because the green team needed to plant trees and put up nesting boxes for native birds and animals. When the green team planted the trees we had to do it in a certain order. The order was tree, shrub, tree, shrub. We planted the trees and the shrubs because the shrubs grow quicker than trees. The shrubs give shelter to the trees whilst they grow and provide a quick habitat for native birds and mammals to hide in. We put the nesting boxes in already established trees around the farm because the trees we planted were just seedlings and couldn't support them.

When we were planting the trees the rain started to pour down on us and we had to run to a tree for shelter, as we were running, the wind was slapping our cheeks. It hurt our cheeks so much. After the rain had calmed down we went back to working on the plants. Then we went back to the hut and ate the most delicious food.

We went to Selbourne near Hagley. We planted 200 trees including shrubs, after we were done with planting the trees and shrubs we went inside to eat sausages and burgers. Once we were done eating we went outside to place the nesting boxes up into some already established trees. Once we placed the nesting boxes into trees we went and said goodbye to Andrew, Sarah, Charlie and George.

We are the Grade 3 Green Team members. We are here to talk about the green bins and the paper recycling boxes in your classrooms.

Every day after fruit break, the green team will be coming into each classroom and collecting the green bins. The green bins are where you put all your food scraps and also compostable things like paper bags. The green bags in the green bins are not plastic. The bags are made out of cornstarch so they are actually compostable.

Paper bags are 100% compostable. You can't put plastic in the green bins and you also shouldn't put food scraps in the normal bins. We encourage you and your family members to try and bring paper bags and reusable items like beeswax wraps and containers in your lunch box instead of plastic bags.

## Green Team

We are going to tell you about the paper and cardboard boxes that you have in the classroom. These boxes are for clean paper and old worksheets. Every Friday, the green team will go to every classroom just before 2nd lunch. We will collect the paper and cardboard boxes and take them down to the old hall. We empty them into 3 blue bins. These bins are collected and the old paper is used to make new paper so other kids can draw on them.

When you walk into the old hall you will see 3 big blue bins. We empty them into the bins and only paper and cardboard can go into them [and remember no plastic!]. The small bins look like a cardboard box with a blue sign on it saying paper and cardboard. We would like to thank Phil for getting the big blue bins for us.

Every time you use the green bins or the paper recycling bins, you are stopping waste from going into landfill and also reducing green-house gases. You are helping us to save our future.
