"SHS Survey"....

Towards the end of Term 2 SHS undertook a survey from an outside agency to collect information about our school. We surveyed parents, staff and our Grade 5 and 6 children.

We received a significant number of responses from all members of the community.

- 91% of the eligible children responded
- 77% of the eligible staff responded
- 305 parents were recorded out of 586. Noting many families have two recorded email addresses.

As a survey sample size this is a large number. In the past few weeks the Leadership Team have spent significant time analysing responses and considering the information with a view to using the key messages for future actions. In two weeks our school will be validated by the Catholic Education Office. We are required to share information with CET about our school.

As a broad summary of the surveys the following should be noted

- Parents have indicated that the 5 key areas surveyed are all either good or excellent in rating.
- Parents have indicated that Resources, Leadership and Teaching and Learning are considered excellent.
- Staff have indicated that the 6 key areas surveyed are all either good or excellent in rating.
- Staff indicated that Resources and Staff Engagement are considered excellent.
- Students have indicated that the 5 key areas surveyed are all either good or excellent in rating
- Students have indicated that Catholic Ethos, Leadership and Teaching and Learning are considered excellent.

The areas that were identified as 'Overall areas of Strength' were

- SHS is a welcome, caring and respectful community
- Children are encouraged to develop a love of learning and to achieve to the best of their ability.
- SHS has a good reputation and provides high quality services to parents, staff and children.
- The grounds, buildings and outdoor facilities are well presented and maintained.
- Parents and staff have confidence in the future direction of SHS.

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The areas that were identified as "Overall opportunities for Growth' were

- Explore how we encourage more active involvement in prayer and the Eucharist.
- Consider how we can involve the community in developing our School Improvement Plan in order for our community to understand our strengths and weaknesses.

Thanks to all members of our community for completing the survey. Your feedback is invaluable. We will provide more detailed information in the weeks ahead including the key outcomes of the validation report. We will also be sharing with our community our Improvement Plan.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number


- 1.Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded
