In our experience children from an early age know what they want and at times they know what they need to do to achieve their goal. Educational research is clear, when families and schools work together for a common goal the chances of success increase significantly. Our teachers look forward to the opportunity next week.

Each year our school also develops goals of what we want to achieve. Our goals are formed by the data we collect. This year we were able to utilise the survey data that parents, students and staff responded to in 2021 to assist us in shaping goals.

Our goals for 2022 are

- To enhance our Catholic Identity with the whole school community and strive to give witness through all our words and actions.
- By the end of 2022 we will have developed a school wide staff wellbeing philosophy, policy and procedures.
- Support the implementation of the CET (Catholic Education Tasmania) whole-system Literacy Project to improve the achievement of all students (Literate Learners for Life every student, every subject, every year)
- By the end of 2022 we will have collaboratively developed a SHS philosophy for the Early Years (Birth 8) so that we have a shared understanding of best practice in the early years.
- To develop a data responsive model of response to instruction
- To support staff in providing timely feedback to students on their academic learning

We have shaped several strategies to assist us in achieving our goals. We look forward to sharing more details about the 2022 goals as this year unfolds.


SHS Swimming Carnival

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1.Complete the online application form <u>www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children</u>

- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
