Responding to the Archbishop's Charter

The Archbishop's Charter for Catholic Schools provides the basis for the Archbishop to 'mandate' Catholic schools and colleges within the Archdiocese of Hobart. The mandate of the Archbishop represents his formal commissioning of a Tasmanian Catholic school or college to act as an evangelising agent of the Archdiocese.

The Charter, which draws inspiration from Sacred Scripture and key Church documents, focuses on four domains:

• Catholic Identity

The person of Christ is at the heart of Catholic education. Therefore we are committed to nurturing our students to proclaim and be witnesses to a distinctively Catholic identity. All its members are called to a personal relationship with Jesus himself and each member of the Catholic school community strives to give Christian witness through words, attitudes and actions.

• Learning

All our learning programs enable students to have an opportunity to hear the Gospel message in such a way that they make a personal decision to embrace the Christian faith and become disciples of Jesus Christ. All our learning programs support students' growth in human and Christian virtues so that they grow as integrated human beings.

• Leadership

Leadership is Christ-centered and is marked by a spirit of service. It is dedicated to the building up of the school community as a community of faith. Leadership that is Christ-centered is open to the working of the Holy Spirit and should be prayerful, collaborative and consultative, respecting the dignity of all.

• Mission

The Catholic school exists as part of the evangelising mission of the Church. It is ecclesial in nature, a place where faith, culture and life are brought into harmony. The Catholic school is a place of real and specified pastoral ministry in communion with the local Bishop.

These domains influence priorities at both the school and system level.

Each year our school also develops goals of what we want to achieve. SHS's goals are formed by the data we collect. This year we were able to utilise the survey data that parents, students and staff responded to in 2021 to assist us in shaping goals. Later this year our school will be mandated by Archbishop Porteous.

One of the goals we developed from the data collected was...

To enhance our Catholic Identity with the whole school community and strive to give witness through all our words and actions.

Some of the initiatives we introduced in 2022 is the creation of two days where we focus on our founders. Children will be provided opportunities to gather in prayer, find out more about the legacies of Edmund Rice and Nano Nagle and engage in activities that celebrate their attributes.

Red Day (Edmund Rice) will be held on Friday 8th April, Green Day (Nano Nagle) will be held later this year. More details will be shared in the newsletter.

PROJECT COMPASSION 2022

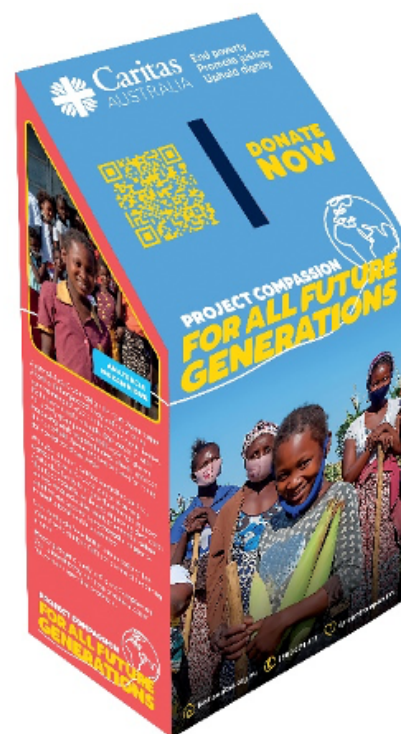


PROTECTING YOURSELF AND OTHERS FROM CORONAVIRUS

Do you have any cold or flu-like symptoms?

This includes fever, runny nose, cough, sore/itchy throat or shortness of breath.

Call your GP or the Public Health Hotline 1800 671 738 to request a COVID-19 test



You must have a referral to be tested.

If there is no testing clinic in your local area, you can travel outside your municipality to have a test.

After being tested, you must self-isolate at home until you receive your results.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
