FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER - YEAR C - 15TH MAY 2022

First Reading

Acts 14:21-27

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe. They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed. On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.


John 13:31-35

Then I heard a loud voice call from the throne, 'You see this city? Here God lives among men. He will make his home among them; they shall be his people, and he will be their God; his name is God-with-them. He will wipe away all tears from their eyes; there will be no more death, and no more mourning or sadness. The world of the past has gone.' Then the One sitting on the throne spoke: 'Now I am making the whole of creation new.'



Dear Parish Family

In today's first reading we hear of Paul and Barnabas putting *fresh heart into the disciples*, encouraging them to persevere in the faith (Acts 14:22). This is exactly what each one of us is called to do as we seek to live out our faith, hope and love for the Risen Lord. The starting point for this task is to be confident that God's grace is sufficient and that, whatever happens, our God is with us at every step of the journey. As we hear in today's second reading: Here God lives among men. He will make his home among them; they shall be his people, and he will be their God; his name is God-with-them (Apocalypse 21:3). Only in this spirit of trust in God's accompaniment can we be true evangelisers after the example of Paul and Barnabas and all those early proclaimers of the new life in Christ!

This coming Tuesday evening, 17th May 34 of our young parishioners will experience the new life of Christ in a special way when they celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time in Sacred Heart Church, Newstead during a special celebration, which begins at 7.00pm. Our candidates have been preparing for this special Sacrament through Faith Sharing sessions centered on their families, based in the Parish and supported by our Schools. Please pray for these young parishioners and their families as they continue to grow in faith within our parish community.

We are able to give of ourselves in love for one another because the Lord has first loved us (see John 13:34), and continues to love us. Together let us take up the Lord's new commandment to love one another: By this love you have for one another, everyone will know that you are my disciples (John 13:35).
