Tapping into Creativity....

“Cre-a-tiv-i-ty – (noun) 1. the state of quality of being creative. 2. the ability to transcend traditional ideas rules, patterns, relationships or the like, and to create meaningful new ideas, forms, methods, interpretations, etc.” – at least according to Webster’s Unabridged Dictionary of the English Language.

A few weeks ago I was chatting with one of our senior students about an extension to his house that was being discussed by his family. He explained to me that his parents had provided him with the opportunity to design the extension. I asked him if he would share the plan with me when it was done. At this point I thought no more of the conversation.

Last week he emailed me the plans. To say I was blown away is an understatement. A ten year old had designed a number of rooms, and an obligatory swimming pool, that could have easily been taken as being designed by a qualified architect. I’m not sure how his conversation started with his parents. What I am sure of is that he has parents who are giving him opportunities to build his creativity.

You know, many people believe that in order to be truly creative, they have to be producing something extraordinary – composing music, making paintings, designing furniture or clothing. These are things that have real, measurable output. However, that is a pretty limited way to look at creativity, as proven by the above example.

Creativity is an attitude toward life and is more a matter of improvisation and inspiration than of producing something we can label as "creative" – something admired or socially useful. Whenever we see something in a new light or from a new perspective, we are being creative. We are asking the brain to be flexible – which it is fully capable of being – and consider our perceptions from a different angle. And when we do that, we develop a growth mindset, one that is open to new thinking and new experiences, and expressed as our personal creativity.

Each of us, if we are open and searching, can become creative in doing those simple things in our lives that are creative and original to us. We can be creative in the way we bring up our children, the way we teach and learn, the way we communicate and listen, and in discovering new ways to approach old, familiar things. Creativity can be expressed in the way we approach a video conference call or in tending a beautiful garden. It’s stretching beyond our old “normal” and reaching for something new to enhance our lives and the lives of those around us.

You see, creativity is there inside us, not in the things we produce. With creativity, we discover and celebrate the fullness of our own personal nature. True creativity is what helps us to make the most of our lives and live up to our own individual potential.

Your own personal creativity is near at hand. You just need to allow yourself to tap into it.

As parents and teachers this week we will all have opportunities to be creative and to enable the children of SHS to be creative, I wonder how we will 'feed' the opportunities?

Learning and Teaching

This week our focus is on Professional Learning Teams from our 2022 Strategic Priorities.

At Sacred Heart our teachers meet every Wednesday in the following Professional Learning Teams;


- K-P
- Grade 1/2
- Grade 3/4
- Grade 5/6

The focus work for the teams varies from week to week but involves Inquiry Cycles, moderating work samples, assessing work, feedback and professional learning through sharing pedagogical practice and ideas and exploring current research. Our Inquiry Cycles have a different focus each time but always follow the same process. The first stage is to scan and assess. During this stage we collect evidence about key areas of student's learning, using data, assessment and observations to identify any issues. From there we prioritise and choose an inquiry cycle question that guides professional learning, setting SMART goals to guide us. The next stage is developing and planning our response to the identified area which may include the following;

- Determining target learning outcomes and student progression in the area of focus
- Thinking about possible causes and factors contributing to the chosen learning issues
- Deciding how and where they will learn more about what to do
- Researching new teaching approaches and the professional learning needed to deliver them
- Agree what evidence will be collected and used to see if new teaching strategies have working

Next comes the act stage where our teachers may be involved in observing, co-teaching, providing feedback and discussing teaching strategies with colleagues as well as meeting to share evidence and give each other feedback. The final stage of the Inquiry cycle is to review the cycle by discussing and critiqueing what impact new approaches have had on student learning and why and sharing their work in order to learn from one another. Our whole school approach this year for our Inquiry Cycle is writing and how we can use the various assessment tools available to us to support students and improve student outcomes.





You must have a referral to be tested.

If there is no testing clinic in your local area, you can travel outside your municipality to have a test.

After being tested, you must self-isolate at home until you receive your results.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
