ter and Sacred Heart....

'Catholic Schools are a vital expression of the mission of the Church in the Archdiocese of Hobart. They are the means by which not only students, but also families and the staff experience the richness and beauty of Christian *life.'* (Archbishop Julian Porteous)

The Archbishop's Charter for Catholic Schools provides the basis for the Archbishop to 'mandate' Catholic schools and colleges within the Archdiocese of Hobart. The mandate of the Archbishop represents his formal commissioning of a Tasmanian Catholic school or college to act as an evangelising agent of the Archdiocese.

The Charter, which draws inspiration from Sacred Scripture and key Church documents, focuses on four domains:

- Catholic Identity
- Learning
- Leadership
- Mission

In 2021 Sacred Heart surveyed staff, parents and students to consider what it was we were doing well in our school and what areas we could enhance. Our Leadership Team analysed the data and developed our response to the Archbishop's Charter.

Last week we were advised that Archbishop Porteous has approved our response and will formally present his acceptance of our response during Catholic Education Week in August. In our response to the Archbishop's Charter we wrote

Catholic Identity

Learning and Teaching

This week our focus is on Professional Learning Teams from our 2022 Strategic Priorities.

The Early Years teachers have been working on a K-2 philosophy. They have been involved in researching current practice and drawing together their experience to develop a philosophy that captures what we believe is crucial in Early Childhood education and what those beliefs look like within the classroom. The philosophy is in draft form at the moment and our Early Years teachers are in the process of seeking feedback to refine the philosophy prior to sharing with the wider community.

Last year, our K-2 teachers conducted an inquiry cycle around ageappropriate pedagogies. Age appropriate pedagogies support teachers to apply a range and balance of teaching approaches and characteristics of quality teaching in their classroom practice. Children learn best when they are engaged in purposeful learning experiences. Teachers are working towards embedding these pedagogies within their classroom practice.



Dear Year 3 & 4 Parents & Guardians.

On **Monday 20th of June 2022**, Year 3 & 4 students will be participating in our 'SHS 3/4 Writer's Festival'. This will be a fun day of activities designed to inspire your child to be a passionately engaged writer!

On the day...

- Students from 3/4 are invited to come to school dressed as a book character. However, please don't feel that you need to go to great expense or trouble with your child's 'costume' for the day!! The majority of book characters are actually very ordinary people. We ask that your child chooses a character from an <u>actual</u> book to represent, rather than a marvel superhero, movie or video game character. Your child could come along as 'a wimpy kid' (aka 'Diary of a Wimpy Kid'), a babysitter (aka 'Baby-Sitter's Club) or a wizard (aka 'Harry Potter'), or any book character they so desire.
- You are invited to join your Yr 3/4 child in our school Library between 8.30am -8.55am to share in 'Milo Reading'. For 20 minutes at the start of the day, you will be able to read a book with your child and drink a warm milo together. RSVP is required. To RSVP please email megan.booth@catholic.tas.edu.au
- Students will be attending an Author/Illustrator talk by award-winning Tasmanian Author/Illustrator 'Christina Booth'. Christina will be sharing her writing process with our students. The book that she will be sharing about is <u>'One Careless Night'</u>.
- Students will be sharing the picture books that they have written and illustrated this Term for their Prep/Yr 1 Buddies.
- Students will need to bring their food on the day as per a normal school day (eg. fruit for fruit-qbreak and food to fill their hungry tummies at First and Second Lunch).
- Students will be participating in writing and word-based activities throughout the day in class groups, grade groups and cross-grade groups. (Therefore, on the day of this event they will not have their regular Monday PE/Music lessons, nor attending Liturgical Singing)
- If students have a pre-loved book at home that they have already read and enjoyed and feel willing to part with, they are invited to take part in our 'Mystery Book Swap'. This activity is optional, but encouraged (and a great way to recycle old reads!). Students will bring home a brown paper bag to pop their pre-loved book in (it could be a chapter or picture book) and will need to write a short description about the book (attached to the paper bag) to tell the potential new book owner what the book is all about. During Second Lunch, students who have brought in a book to swap will then be able to swap their mystery book for a new pre-loved 'Mystery Book' to take home and read.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1.Complete the online application form <u>www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children</u>

- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
