
Dear Parish Family

The focus for this 10th Meeting is Family love: a vocation and a path to holiness. Along with this focus is an acknowledgement that there are many different ways in which families are comprised. And let's make use of three important words that Pope Francis encourages all of us to use often in family life: Please, Sorry, Thank you!

Today's Gospel passage (Luke 9:51-62) is a stark reminder of the challenges of following the way of Jesus. It comes after Luke's account of the feeding of the 5,000 (Luke 9:11-17 - last Sunday's Gospel), Peter's declaration about Jesus (Luke 9:18-20), the Transfiguration (Luke 9:28-36) and a number of important examples of the nature of discipleship. It is worth reading over and reflecting upon the whole of Luke 9:1-62. Our psalm provides us with a response to the Lord's challenge to follow along the road of true discipleship: O Lord, it is you who are my portion and cup; it is you yourself who are my prize (Psalm 15:5). 
