THIRD SUNDAY ADVENT (YEAR A) - 11 DECEMBER 2022

FIRST READING

Isaiah 35:1-6, 10

Let the wilderness and the dry-lands exult, let the waste land rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonguil, let it rejoice and sing for joy. The glory of Lebanon is bestowed on it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they shall see the glory of the Lord, the splen dour of our God. Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. 'Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you." Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy, for those the Lord has ransomed shall return. They will come to Zion shouting for joy, everlasting joy on their faces; joy and gladness will go with them and sorrow and lament be ended.



(R.) Lord, come and save us.

- It is the Lord who keeps faith for ever, who is just to those who are oppressed. It is he who gives bread to the hungry, the Lord, who sets prisoners free. (R.)
- 2. It is the Lord who gives sight to the blind, who raises up those who are bowed down, the Lord, who protects the stranger and upholds the widow and orphan. (R.)
- 3. It is the Lord who loves the just but thwarts the path of the wicked. The Lord will reign for ever, Zion's God, from age to age. (R.)

SECOND READING

James 5:7-10

Be patient, brothers, until the Lord's coming. Think of a farmer: how patiently he waits for the precious fruit of the ground until it has had the autumn rains and the spring rains! You too have to be patient; do not lose heart, because the Lord's coming will be soon. Do not make complaints against one another, brothers, so as not to be brought to judgement yourselves; the Judge is already to be seen waiting at the gates. For your example, brothers, in submitting with patience, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

GOSPEL

Matthew 11:2-11

John in his prison had heard what Christ was doing and he sent his disciples to ask him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else?' Jesus answered, 'Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me.' As the messengers were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the people about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swaying in the breeze? No? Then what did you go out to see? A man wearing fine clothes? Oh no, those who wear fine clothes are to be found in palaces. Then what did you go out for? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and much more than a prophet: he is the one of whom scripture says: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way before you. I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, a greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.'



Dear Parish family,

On the third Sunday of Advent, we light the rose-coloured candle of the advent wreath. The colour rose, which is similar to the other violet-coloured candles, yet distinct, is used because it points to the increasing sense of joy that is building in this time of anticipation for the coming of the Messiah.

John the Baptist, who's mission was to prepare people's hearts and minds for the Messiah, is found in prison in this week's gospel – a place where joy is not usually found. But as he hears the stories of Jesus' activities and teachings, he is filled with joyful anticipation as he asks his disciples to find out if indeed he is the one who they had been waiting for.

Many people find themselves in a similar position to John – whether that be in prison, or in poverty, homelessness, in the midst of a relationship breakdown, sickness or bereavement. To hear of the coming of Christ has the potential to transform that sense of sorrow and imprisonment into joy and freedom.

If you are finding yourself overwhelmed at this time by the various pressures of life, do as Jesus told John's disciples to do, i.e., look around at our world and see the signs around us. We may see many bleak realities, but amongst this, there are signs that point to the growth of God's kingdom on earth - many who have been sick are made well, those who came as strangers or refugees are being welcomed into the community, young people are taking on responsibility for care of others and the planet, and families welcome the gift of new life as babies are born!

Let's take some time this week to reflect on the good things in our lives and our world and give thanks for these gifts. May they help us to enter the joy of the season to come as we welcome the birth of Christ into our world and in the depth of our hearts.
