Choosing a school

In the past few weeks we have begun the process of Kinder enrolment for 2024. It might seem early but families are looking at schools for their children. Choosing a school is a significant and important decision. What do you expect of a school in educating your child?

There are, and should be, obligations and expectations placed directly at the front door of any school if they are to be viewed as a good or great place for learning. Questions that I would need answers to would include:

- How does the school create a positive climate for learning?
- How do you engage and motivate students to learn and make positive life choices?
- What attitudes, values, skills and dispositions does the school see as important and prioritise time to?

The answers should give greater or diminished confidence as to whether this is the school for you and your family. When choosing the school you are signing up to these beliefs and the expectation that the school will 'make good' on what they say they will do! This is a big step towards a successful education for your child but is not the only step. There are going to be fundamental values that are at the heart of the school, its philosophy and therefore why it goes about things in the way it does. You, not just your child, is 'signing up' for these values when you join the school community. Honesty, self respect, integrity, teamwork, resilience and equity are values fundamental to our school.

Sacred Heart is a Catholic School, we are not a private school! We will always embrace the marginalised and the disadvantaged, and welcome all that want the kind of education that our school offers. We will still keep striving to set high expectations for all whilst acknowledging not all begin on the same starting line when they arrive.

I honestly believe if we simply demand of ourselves what we demand of others, focus on being part of solutions rather than just highlighting problems, and treat all with respect and dignity we would not need policies, protocols, rules and regulations. There is no one that can profess to be perfect in all of these pursuits, but if we are not interested in trying to live these values and beliefs out more consistently, even if only in the very least, as models for our children, then I am not sure SHS is going to meet your needs. This is part of the conversations that take place with new enrolments and, in particular, Kindergarten enrolments for next year. It should also be part of our shared ongoing conversation with each other as existing members of Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School.




On ANZAC Day students are invited to participate in the ANZAC Day March.

Last week Phoebe Robert's dad Cal came in to tell us all about the ProDig machinery and about what's happening in our school with all of the improvements.

We all got to have a go sitting in the digger and he had ProDig caps for the whole class.

It wasn't all just caps and sitting in diggers though. We also learnt these fast facts:

- 1. The machinery here is taking out 100 tonnes of concrete and replacing it with 100 tonnes of gravel and 100 tonnes of concrete.
- 2. The Bobcat weighs 3 tonnes and there is a little emergency exit in the back window for a quick escape in case the bobcat tips over and the driver gets stuck.
- 3. You can't operate the digger unless the red isolation lock lever is pulled.
- 4. The diggers all have air conditioning and they run on diesel.

There will be no lunch orders from SPC on this day.



WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1.Complete the online application form <u>www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children</u>
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
