It is timely to reflect on our 38 Catholic schools in Tasmania. We educate over 15,000 children with more than 2,500 employees. The proud reputation of Catholic schools today is based on the strong tradition built by parishes and religious orders who founded Catholic education in Tasmania. Our schools continue to aspire to the same distinctive mission and ideals of maintaining high academic standards within a faith-based education framework."

Historically most of our schools, including Sacred Heart, were established by hard working parishioners and members of religious orders. Schools that are built today rely predominantly on government funding. When our school was built 150 years ago governments provided no financial support. When we reflect on the past custodians of Sacred Heart and the legacy they left we have much to be thankful for.

In particular we acknowledge the Presentation Sisters and Christian Brothers. Our school is founded on the charisms of Nano Nagle and Edmund Rice. It is our responsibility as the current custodians of Sacred Heart to continue to build and enhance our culture. We are responsible for leaving our school in an even better place than when we arrived.

Catholic Education Week is also an opportunity to give thanks to our wider community and the gifts they bring. Thank you to the parents and community members who work in partnership with our school. We give thanks to our Board Members, Parents and Friends, those who volunteer in classrooms, sports carnivals, fairs and camps. Thank you to all our staff at Sacred Heart, a staff who invest in our students in every aspect of their education and lives. And of course none of this would be possible without the students of Sacred Heart. To be able to work in a school where students inquire, approach the day with curiosity, passion, resilience, awe and wonder is a blessing.

FRIENDOLOGY

Our Early Childhood Friendology Lessons have been focussing on responding to others in respectful and friendly ways. We have been role playing what to say to our friends when they tell us something surprising, interesting or unusual. We have also been exploring what our body language and facial expressions communicate to others.

Body language is a powerful way to convey emotions that may not be expressed verbally. It can give cues about comfort, trust and engagement in a relationship. Positive body language such as maintaining eye contact and smiling fosters connection, empathy and understanding. While negative body language can create misunderstandings.

We have had lots of fun with our role plays, practising our 'scrunchy faces' when responding to our friends and then practising our 'friendly faces'. Awareness, practise and open conversation is helping us to cultivate strong, healthy friendships here at Sacred Heart.

Nano Nagle is one of the most important person to *ever* live with changing education and founded the presentation sisters. Nano Nagle lived in Cork, Ireland and walked around the streets at night starting many Schools to give the poor children who couldn't go. After this the presentation sisters travelled to Launceston and opened our school in 1873.





Some Grade 6 students caught the bus to Star of the Sea in GeorgeTown, where we gathered all together to celebrate Nano Nagle. Before we started to learn about Nano Nagle, we played some REALLY fun games with everyone. WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
