FIRST READING

Isaiah 45:1.4-6

Thus says the Lord to his anointed, to Cyrus, whom he has taken by his right hand to subdue nations before him and strip the loins of kings, to force gateways before Him that their gates be closed no more: It is for the sake of my servant Jacob, of Israel my chosen one, that I have called you by your name, conferring a title though you do not know me. I am the Lord, unrivalled; there is no other God besides me. Though you do not know me, I arm you that men may know from the rising to the setting of the sun that, apart from me, all is nothing.


RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 95:1. 3-5. 7-10. R. v.7

We always mention you in our prayers and thank God for you all, and constantly remember before God our Father how you have shown your faith in action, worked for love and persevered through hope, in our Lord Jesus Christ. We know, brothers, that God loves you and that you have been chosen, because when we brought the Good News to you, it came to you not only as words, but as power and as the Holy Spirit and as utter conviction.

GOSPEL

Matthew 22:15-21

The Pharisees went away to work out between them how to trap Jesus in what he said. And they sent their disciples to him, together with the Herodians, to say, 'Master, we know that you are an honest man and teach the way of God in an honest way, and that you are not afraid of anyone, because a man's rank means nothing to you. Tell us your opinion, then. Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?' But Jesus was aware of their malice and replied, 'You hypocrites! Why do you set this trap for me? Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he said, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.'

A VOCATION VIEW

We do not choose a vocation completely on our own. We must prayerfully reflect on how we can best give to God what is God's and then live as though everything depends on God.

We are located on the country of the Tyerenotepanner, the Panninher and the Litarimirina people of the Stoney Creek Nation. We acknowledge and pay respect to the Traditional Owners, who have cared for land, sea, waterways and sky, as the ongoing custodians, for thousands of years. We honour Elders, past and present.

We acknowledge the continued deep spiritual attachment and relationship of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples to this country and commit ourselves to the ongoing journey of reconciliation.

Dear Parish family,

Sometimes life is easier to approach in a black and white kind of way – a point of view is good, or it is bad; an action is either right or it is wrong.

Often in Jesus' ministry he reminds us that life isn't always that simple, the human community is a complex one with various loyalties and obligations due a range of factors, such as citizenship, employment, or our relationships.

Despite the attempt of the pharisees to put Jesus into a box in terms of his loyalties – God or the Roman empire – Jesus' answer highlights the point that we have various loyalties, and when put together in a balanced way, needn't be in conflict with each other: 'give back' to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.'

In fact, they support one another. To do our duty as citizens of a community; to pay our taxes, obey the road rules, respecting the rights of others etc, goes hand in hand with our duty as baptised Christians: to love God, and love our neighbour.

Let's give thanks to God that we live in a place where we can enjoy the benefits of being citizens of a community, exercising our rights and responsibilities to those around us, and that we are free to practice our religion. At the same time, we pray for those throughout the world for whom such rights are unjustly hindered, that they may be sustained in their faith, their hope for a better society, and the love they share with one another.




