FRIENDOLOGY

This year at Sacred Heart, classes will have a Wellbeing Lesson each fortnight. We use the UR Strong Program, Friendology and complement this with a wide variety of other activities. Mindfulness, Intuition, Neuroplasticity and the connection between our thoughts, feelings and actions, are just some of the topics that we will be covering.

Wellbeing Lessons are structured so that the activities can be carried on in the classroom setting but also, so the students can share wellbeing strategies with you at home.

At Sacred Heart we have a RADAR team. The team includes Brent Wilson (Principal), Adele Murphy (Deputy Principal), Anita Mercer (Student Support Coordinator), Suze Chapple (Pastoral Care), Steph Sluis (School Counsellor) and Allison Hicks (School Counsellor). This team meets regularly each term to discuss additional support that we can offer the students in our care here at Sacred Heart.

If you ever have any concerns or questions about the wellbeing of your child, please contact Brent, Adele or Anita and we will ensure that we can prioritise and coordinate the appropriate support structure so that your child feels happy and safe at school.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Catholic Education Tasmania supports schools in offering children creative play and learning within our outdoor spaces through our Outdoor Play and Learning guidance.

It is timely to restate some purposes of this policy, being:

- Support learning and creative play with reasonable levels of risktaking.
- Offer age appropriate activities and items to encourage development of gross motor, collaboration and risk assessment skills.
- Enable children to extend their capabilities.



- Loose parts imaginative play & building.
 e.g. Logs, sticks, milk crates, rocks, tyres, mud play, etc
- Limited tree climbing / play
- Approved items disassembled
- Fire pit usage & tricycles ridden without helmets

If your child(ren) are participating, you may wish to discuss how they are finding this? You are welcome to contact your Principal with feedback, or queries.

If there is no testing clinic in your local area, you can travel outside your municipality to have a test.


After being tested, you must self-isolate at home until you receive your results.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working-with-children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
