Nurturing Self Advocacy in Your Child

Empowering your child with the skills of self-advocacy from a young age lays the groundwork for their future success and resilience. Here's a guide to help you foster these essential abilities in your child:

- Cultivate Identity and Values: Encourage open discussions with your child about their interests, strengths, and needs. Simple questions like, 'What do you enjoy doing?' or 'Do you need help with that?' foster self-awareness and confidence.
- Build Confidence: Role-playing scenarios, such as approaching a teacher about a concern, can boost your child's confidence. Start with small steps and offer positive feedback to reinforce their progress.
- Enhance Problem-Solving Skills: Encourage your child to tackle real-life situations and conflicts. Role-play different solutions and discuss the outcomes to develop their problem-solving abilities.
- Foster Decision-Making: Allow your child to make simple decisions and gradually increase complexity as they grow. Discussing the pros and cons of choices helps them learn to advocate for their preferences.
- Encourage Goal setting: Help your child identify their goals and brainstorm strategies to achieve them. Whether it's fundraising for a cause or mastering a new skill, setting, and pursuing goals builds determination and self-advocacy.
- Establish Personal Boundaries: Teach your child to assert their boundaries in a respectful manner. Activities like the 'circle of friends' can help them understand and communicate their comfort levels.
- Manage Emotions: Support your child in understanding and regulating their emotions. By learning to stay calm and composed, they can effectively express themselves when advocating for their needs.
- Understand Rights and Responsibilities: Introduce your child to their rights and responsibilities using child-friendly resources. Emphasize the importance of respecting others while asserting their own rights.

Empower your child to become a confident self-advocate, equipped to navigate life's challenges with resilience and integrity. By nurturing these skills, you're preparing them for a future where they can confidently advocate for themselves and others.

Our Sacred Heart students have done an amazing job of settling into the routines of a new school year. Our classrooms and playgrounds are buzzing with happy and excited children.

We do acknowledge though, that saying goodbye in the mornings can be tricky for many of us. Often a weekend, an illness or a break in routine can exacerbate this. I would love to share some useful strategies for making mornings smoother.

Expect emotion - feeling nervous or worried about leaving a parent in the morning is normal, so expect that your child may experience these emotions, even if they haven't before. In these situations, keeping your emotions in check is critical as your child is aware of your feelings and sensitive to non-verbal cues. Children watch the adults in their lives and read faces to determine how they should feel. If you can manage a smile, it will help them know they are safe in their school environment.

Acknowledge how your child is feeling - It is important to accept and respect a child's temporary unhappiness as it is very real and very normal. Ensure you have enough time in the mornings and speak calmly and positively. You could say things like "I know you feel sad when Mummy leaves, but you will have fun and I will be back very soon." Learning to cope with sadness is an important learning process for your child.

Create a goodbye ritual - children love consistency and a goodbye ritual can be calming. You could consider a specific song to play in the car, giving your child a kiss to "hold" in their hand while you're away, singing a special "see you later" song together, or giving an extra big bear hug. A quick goodbye, a kiss, a cuddle and telling your child that you will be back will also help them feel safe, relaxed, and comfortable.

Trust your child's teacher - While you are creating a new relationship with the teacher in your child's classroom, keep in mind that your child's teacher is trained to help your child develop social and emotional strategies, offering appropriate redirection. Most often a child will stop crying as soon as you are a few steps away. You will always be contacted if this is not the case.

Separating from a family member can be tricky, but I hope these ideas are a reminder that allowing enough time, staying positive and trusting the process is critical at this time. This phase is one of many steps forward in the growth and independence of your child. While it might feel strange taking a small step back, the staff at Sacred Heart are here to support you.

Outdoor Play and Learning

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Catholic Education Tasmania supports schools in offering children creative play and learning within our outdoor spaces through our Outdoor Play and Learning guidance.

It is timely to restate some purposes of this policy, being:

- Support learning and creative play with reasonable levels of risktaking.
- Offer age appropriate activities and items to encourage development of gross motor, collaboration and risk assessment skills.
- Enable children to extend their capabilities.

Examples of potential activities with suitable risk controls include:

- Loose parts imaginative play & building.
 e.g. Logs, sticks, milk crates, rocks, tyres, mud play, etc
- Limited tree climbing / play
- Approved items disassembled
- Fire pit usage & tricycles ridden without helmets

If your child(ren) are participating, you may wish to discuss how they are finding this? You are welcome to contact your Principal with feedback, or queries.

Do you have any cold or flu-like symptoms?

This includes fever, runny nose, cough, sore/itchy throat or shortness of breath.

Call your GP or the Public Health Hotline 1800 671 738 to request a COVID-19 test



You must have a referral to be tested.

If there is no testing clinic in your local area, you can travel outside your municipality to have a test.

After being tested, you must self-isolate at home until you receive your results.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
