How do we help children build resilience?

'There will always be rocks in the road ahead of us. They will be stumbling blocks or stepping stones; it all depends on how we use them.' (Anonymous)

Late last week we advised Grade 5 children and families that we made the decision to postpone the Grade 5 Camp for health reasons. Sharing with the children on Friday afternoon that they wouldn't be attending the camp, that most children had thought about for a long time, evoked mixed feelings. Clearly many of the children were disappointed, some of the children were quick to come up with how they could still make it happen and some children may have been thinking that 'life wasn't fair'.

We all know life is like that, challenges and change happens.

Our role as the key adults in the lives of children is to support them in building resilience. To do this we need to;

- Let children experience disappointment so they learn sadness doesn't last forever
- Validate children's fears and help them to make plans even if they are scared
- Let children take (reasonable) risks and experience natural consequences
- Encourage children to try new things, make mistakes and learn from their mistakes
- Give children opportunities to make their own decisions and help them problem solve
- Tell stories of people who faced hard times, persisted and grew stronger as a result
- Reframe challenges as short-term problems and opportunities for learning
- Remind children that although we can't control everything that happens to us, we can control how we respond.

We all know this year each one of us will be faced with a challenge and most likely more than one. Our children will also be faced with moments that require them to draw upon the qualities listed. The mindset we utilise in these occasions is more likely to eventuate in a positive outcome if we focus on utilising a growth mindset and a 'glass half-full' attitude.

At Sacred Heart we often ask the children of our school to remember how lucky we are. If we turn on the world news each night we see so many regions of the world engaged in life threatening circumstances. Look around our school this week and notice the goodness.

The Emotional Freedom Technique (EFT) of Tapping is an excellent tool to support children in self managing their emotions. It is a form of meditation that involves tapping energy points on the face and body.

Primary classes have had some visits to the Wellbeing Room this term, to be introduced to this technique. Students use their fingers to gently tap their face, hands and upper body while saying positive affirmations like 'I am loved, I am brave, I am safe.'

Scientific studies have shown that tapping allows the brain and body to release stress and negative emotions, as well as calm and regulate the central nervous system.

Ask your primary person to show you this technique, it's a great one for bedtime!



Call your GP or the Public Health Hotline 1800 671 738 to request a COVID-19 test



You must have a referral to be tested.

If there is no testing clinic in your local area, you can travel outside your municipality to have a test.

After being tested, you must self-isolate at home until you receive your results.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form <u>www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children</u>
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
