In the footsteps of Pope Francis.....

'Things have a price and can be for sale. But people have a dignity that is priceless and worth far more than things.' (Pope Francis)

Sacred Heart Staff along with Larmenier Catholic Primary School Staff spent time with Dr Dan White, former Executive Director of Tasmanian Catholic Education and Sydney Catholic Schools on the final day of Term 1.

Dan took us on a journey of discovery of the life of Pope Francis. Pope Francis was born Jorge Mario Bergoglio on the 17th December 1936. Born in Buenos Aires, Argentina, Bergoglio worked for a time as a bouncer and a janitor as a young man before training to be a chemist and working as a technician in a food science laboratory. He was ordained a Catholic priest in 1969. He became the Archbishop of Buenos Aires in 1998 and was created a cardinal in 2001 by Pope John Paul 11.

Following the resignation of Pope Benedict XV1 in 2013, a papal conclave elected Bergoglio as his successor on 13 March. He chose Francis as his papal name in honour of Saint Francis of Assissi. Throughout his public life, Francis has been noted for his humility, emphasis on God's mercy, international visibility as pope, concern for the poor, and commitment to interreligious dialogue.

All Tasmanian Catholic schools support our staff by spending time by reflecting on our own faith and nourishing our spirituality as we too are expected to lead this with the children in our care.

We were challenged on the day to consider what it is that God is calling us to do?

Dan reminded us that Pope Francis is the author of the document Laudato si'. Laudato si' is the second encyclical of Pope Francis. The encyclical has the subtitle on care for our common home. The document links the issues of poverty, which has been a major issue in his papacy, and the environment; he insists that the world must 'hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor.'

We were challenged to consider that we had been entrusted with this planet. How do we want to protect and save it?

Dan used scripture passages to engage our thinking and reminded us of the exceptional qualities of Pope Francis, sympathy, empathy, kindness and compassion. We reflected on where we are with our encounters at the margins and with the marginalised?

The day was a wonderful reminder of why Catholic schools exist, to provide a place for all to grow closer to our God.






PROTECTING YOURSELF AND OTHERS FROM CORONAVIRUS

COVID-19 testing for all Tasmanian residents

Do you have any cold or flu-like symptoms?

This includes fever, runny nose, cough, sore/itchy throat or shortness of breath.

Call your GP or the Public Health Hotline 1800 671 738 to request a COVID-19 test



You must have a referral to be tested.

If there is no testing clinic in your local area, you can travel outside your municipality to have a test.

After being tested, you must self-isolate at home until you receive your results.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working with children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
