Dear Parish Family, Some thoughts to ponder for this week,

Nowadays, cyber networks are considered new cultural phenomena. What makes "Facebook" and "Instagram" a big success in the virtual generation? What makes cellular phones an untiring passion among the old and young? The activity that ignites our passion is to connect with others- to have friends

It's amazing how technology brings people from the other world see each other through the window of screens- most of the time, hidden and faceless, yet exciting. Though not physically present, the virtual person we meet online, we consider them as our "friends."

Today, we experience an evolution of the meaning of the word "friend." A friend is someone linked to us by technology through computer, gadgets or cellular phones. Someone we spend in the chat rooms. Someone with whom we engage in sports and hobbies. But what is a real friend?

The Gospel today challenges our shallow concept and definition of friendship. Jesus describes friendship in terms of love, a deep love, a real love, someone who is willing to die for others. When the Lord says there is no greater love than to lay down your life for a friend, we are challenged that a friend is not an ordinary buddy we spend for hobbies or parties. Jesus brings us to the deeper level

of friendship, who has the capacity, the willingness and the desire to make the life of the other better through sacrifice. When Jesus calls His disciples his friends, He knows that he will lay down his life for them. You are also called by Jesus to be His friend and He is willing to make a sacrifice for you. But how about us in return, are we considering Jesus as our friend?

This Easter time is the best moment to examine how much we appreciate our friendship with God as He offers us His Son who continues his personal contact with us in the depths of our hearts.


