#### A VOCATION VIEW



Jesus showed himself to the Eleven and said to them, 'Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised is saved; he who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.' And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied

#### Dear Parish Family, Some thoughts to ponder for this week,

Today, we celebrate the feast of the Ascension of our Lord. Mark in his Gospel said, "Jesus was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God (16:19)." Sitting at the right hand of God is a figurative expression. St Augustine interprets it as, "for by sitting we express habitation, as we say of a person, he sat himself down in that country for many years; in this way then we believe that Christ dwells at the right hand of the Father; for all is right there, since there is no misery." Jesus who is seated at the right hand of the Father is a priest forever in the order of Melchizedek (Ps 110:4). The present office of Jesus is that of High Priest and intercessor, who pleads for us and represents us, Himself to govern our destiny.



Jesus Christ is the most perfect intercessor – in the letter to the Hebrews, it is said, Jesus holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues for ever. Consequently, he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intersession for them (7:24-25)." Paul states to the Romans (8:34) "Jesus Christ who died and who was raised, is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us."

Jesus Christ is the Perpetual High Priest- in the Old Testament, the weakness of the priesthood was that the priest, including the high priest, always died, and so there was no continuity to their intercession. Moreover, they entered the Holy of Holies just once a year. But our High Priest- Lord Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever. In Him we have perpetual continuity; He is ever present in the presence of God, interceding on our behalf.

Lord Jesus Christ be near to defend you, within you to refresh you, around you to preserve you, before you to guide you, behind you to justify you, above you to bless you; who lives and reigns with the Father and the holy spirit, god for evermore. (Tenth century prayer)


