Sacred Heart Feast Day....

"Heroes lift themselves up and make themselves greater by pursuing something greater than their own self-interest..." (Chris Lowney)

I'm constantly amazed by the capacity of children. Your children and mine have the ability to be empathetic people. They understand that there are many people in the world who are far worse off than they are. Children want to make a positive difference to the lives of those less fortunate than themselves when they understand how fortunate they are in their own lives. As a Catholic school we will always explicitly teach by our words and our deeds that "a life lived with compassion is a life worth living". At Sacred Heart our challenge will always be to live as our motto proclaims "Go forward and share God's gift of love to make our world a better place.". Each and every day children, parents and staff reflect the values of our founders. All around us are members of our community who are "Christ like" in the way they live. We all have the capacity to perform heroic acts. For me that provides great hope for the future.

This week challenge yourself to be a witness to heroic deeds. None of us will ever climb a tall building in a single bound or be faster than a speeding bullet but all of us have the capacity to be co-creators of a human race underpinned by respecting the dignity of all. This is the most heroic act any of us can ever achieve.

Tomorrow 7th June is our feast day. On this day we celebrate the Sacred Heart of Jesus. As a school we gather to celebrate Mass in the Church of the Apostles in the morning. As a Catholic School this is why our school was established almost 151 years ago, to celebrate that Christ is the heart of our faith and school.

After Mass children will spend time participating in activities that are designed to grow our appreciation for others. This year the children will be arranged into groups designed to enhance our House groups. In the afternoon we will gather to watch the talent of SHS at SHS's Got Talent. Representatives from each class will participate in a talent show. We don't need to wait for the Feast of the Sacred Heart to reflect core Christian principles. Each one of us should continue to look for ways we can place others first and ourselves second. Working in a school community we see hundreds of examples of children and adults consistently looking for and enacting positive disciple values.

As members of the SHS community this is what we are called to do. One day each one of us will no longer be students, parents or staff members of the SHS community. It is our responsibility, as the current custodians of SHS, to leave our school in a better place than we find it. We must continue to challenge ourselves to be better people so our school becomes an even greater school.

Imagine for a moment how many people have been connected to SHS in the 151 years of our existence. It is safe to say there have been close to 10,000 students in that time, more than 20,000 parents and close to 1000 staff.

Each one of us is just one of the 31,000 (approx) community members.

I wonder how each one of us will be remembered in 151 years time?

I wonder what they will celebrate about us?

I wonder what each one of us is doing now to make SHS the very best Catholic School for the children of SHS?

I wonder if we are noticing and celebrating the gifts of each and every boy and girl, each member of the SHS community?

I wonder how we will share our gifts in 2024?

Wellbeing Lessons



In our Early Childhood Health and Wellbeing Lessons, we have been focussing on identifying our emotions. Acknowledging and accepting emotion is how we build our emotional intelligence. This is important for our overall well being.

Here you can see us taking the first step towards identifying our emotions. We are exploring the signals that our bodies give us when we feel certain emotions.

There is no right or wrong here because all emotions are valid and help us to learn and grow. We take away judgement by using the words 'Rough' and 'Smooth' when we talk about our feelings.

It is fascinating, even as adults, to make a habit of checking in with ourselves emotionally and becoming attune with the signals that our own bodies give us.

Understanding and managing our emotions helps us to navigate friendships, face challenges and make useful decisions. It also fosters our empathy and resilience.

Call your GP or the Public Health Hotline 1800 671 738 to request a COVID-19 test


You must have a referral to be tested.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
