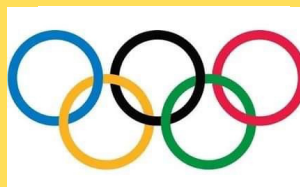

Wellbeing Lessons



Our Emotional Resilience Training explores the metaphor of roads and driving. Here you can see us learning the importance of keeping two hands on our steering wheel and keeping our eyes focussed on the road ahead. The learning here is about perspective. In life, it is important to 'stay in your own lane' and be aware of your own feelings, thoughts and actions.

Unfortunately we can form the habit of 'looking through the rear view mirror' or becoming fixated on the other 'drivers on the road', potentially judging and blaming them for the circumstances that we are encountering. But the rear view mirror is small and our front windscreen is big, for a reason. If we aren't focussed on what's ahead, we risk losing control.

The beauty of Emotional Resilience Training is that our students are exercising their right to choose and in that, they are taking responsibility for the growth of their emotional intelligence. What an exciting journey!

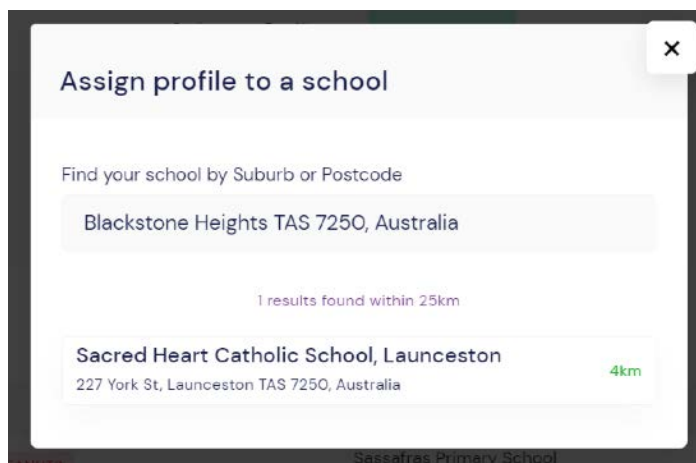

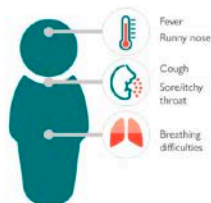

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
