#### Co-Teachers 2015

As discussed briefly last year we will be employing co-teachers to work in all classrooms P-6 between 1-2 days a week. The main and core aim of this is to further enhance the learning outcomes of our students particularly in the areas of literacy and numeracy, with a specific focus of problem solving and critical thinking in these areas. Groups of students will be identified to work with co-teachers for a period of time based on their literacy and numeracy needs.

#### Whether students are working in this group or remaining with the rest of the class – all students benefit.

- ✓ The students working with co-teachers benefit as they get specific support based on their needs.
- ✓ The students remaining in class benefit as the class size is reduced and the teacher is left with a smaller number of students to give more personalised explicit teaching and time to.

A letter to all parents will be sent out explaining this new initiative in more detail next week.

#### S.H.S. New Terms And Conditions

You will hopefully have received correspondence today around new Terms and Conditions for enrolment and payment of fees. The first point I would like to make is that this is a new requirement of all Catholic primary and secondary schools in Tasmania from Tasmanian Catholic Education Office. It is not something that we have decided to do to make things more complex for parents!

The second point is that in terms of fees and payment of fees -the day-to-day reality for parents will not change. Some parents will have to re-establish some payment plans, however even though the annual fees will be billed in full early in the year, previous approaches to paying this off won't change.

The realities of the modern world, I imagine have resulted in the legal documenting of the 'contract' that is the enrolment form parents sign when enrolling their child in a school. The last point and most important one for me is that the ability of parents in being able to pay full fees will not be and should not be a factor in the ongoing enrolment of a child at S.H.S. Please if any queries or questions or concerns contact myself or our office to discuss.

#### **Early Numeracy Interviews**

This coming week Grade 1-2 teachers will be working 1:1 with your child conducting 'Early Numeracy Interviews'. Our Prep classes will also be doing this in coming weeks. Each class teacher will be released to work 1:1 with each child in their class working through a series of numeracy tasks. These interviews are invaluable as they give a clear understanding to the class teacher of where each student is. More importantly the interviews identify what are the next steps that your child needs to enhance their numeracy. This data is critical for the teacher to know where each child is at and then support each child in their numeracy development.

Last year we provided an information sheet to each family of the interviews and where your child's development is at, at the beginning of this year. We will do the same again this year.

#### **New Sports Polo Tops**

Hopefully all students now have their new polo tops. A big thanks to Rebecca Millwood (and family) and Kelly Cox (and family) for their organisation pre the two Uniform Shop Days and during the two days. In any transition there is always a lot more work to begin with and at the beginning of this year, that was certainly the case.

The new polo tops are more comfortable for students, more durable and better designed. *Just as importantly it helps our students connect to their House Team* – seeing other students around the school who are in the same House by the colour on their polo top. *This helps students connect to a smaller community within our larger school community.* It will also be so much easier on sports carnival days in knowing which students from which House have won events etc.

#### Parent / Student / Teacher Goal Setting

In week 3 of this term, we will conduct our first Parent/Student/Teacher meetings. The focus will be on parents identifying and naming what you hope and aspire for you child to achieve in the 2015 year. Where comfortable, we would encourage you to bring your child along.

Students will bring home information on this tomorrow. Returning the booking sheet provided to your youngest child's teacher by Wednesday can make bookings 11<sup>th</sup> of February. Appointments will be conducted on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup>, Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> of February.

Parents of students in Prep to grade 2 will also have opportunities for meeting with the grade teachers around more general grade information.

#### Structure of the School Day

There will be a small change to the structure of our school day. In essence we will keep the same 2-hour block to begin the day but increase the middle block for a longer period of time and as a result shorten our afternoon block. We believe increasing our middle block to help with our teaching time for mathematics and making our afternoon session shorter supports our students learning. The last session of the day where students' concentration is at its shortest makes sense to be shorter than the morning and middle blocks where concentration is better. Initially it will take a little time for students to wait 30 minutes longer for their lunch break. We encourage parents (and class teachers will talk with students also about this) to think in terms of 2 lunch breaks. Half your lunch at 10:50 and the other half of your lunch at 1:20 p.m.
